Metal Sculpture Competition

Transforming scrap metal from farms into striking works of art is raising the profile of Boort as a tourist destination and feeding hope of even greater things to come.

The key strategy is the gradual construction of a metal sculpture trail around Little Lake Boort, boosted by an annual competition as part of the Boort Show and regular workshops led by an accomplished metal artist.

The show, planned for 10 October at Boort Park, will again host the Boort Sculpture by the Lake competition, offering a total of \$4,000 in prize money across five categories.

Rod Poxon, secretary of the Boort Development Committee and a committee member of the Boort Business and Tourism Council, said both those organisations were behind the initiative.

"Last year's competition was a great success, with more than 40 entries coming from as far afield as the Mornington Peninsula"

"This time we've decided to make a cormorant, which will then feature at Boort Sculpture by the Lake before being permanently displayed as part of the emerging metal sculpture trail here."

"The latest addition to the trail is a highly impressive spanner sculpture generously donated by John Piccoli, designed to honour his Swiss roots. "The artworks fit in perfectly with the walking track that runs around the lake."

The Piccolis will stage an open day at their **Star Spanner Sculpture Garden**, 10km from Boort, **the day after the show (11 October).** Competition entries are accepted until 9 October, with winners announced at the Boort Show. Fees are \$20 for adults and \$10 for juniors.

The Star Spanner Sculpture Garden Open Day will run from 10:00am to 2:00pm on the Sunday. Entry costs \$5.

It is fantastic to see the co-operation with other committees and volunteers, resulting in several ideas finally coming to fruition. The development and growth of the 'Sculpture by the Lake' Competition, in conjunction with the workshops, sculpture trail around the lake and more than 7,000 visitors to the Star Spanner Sculpture Gardens has an incredible impact on both tourism and business in Boort. The strong partnerships and growth with our other main tourism operators – Simply Tomatoes, Aussie Wool Quilts and Salute Oliva – is also a terrific drawcard for visitors to our town. We thank and congratulate these businesses on their professionalism and for looking after our valued visitors.

The completion of signage, improved access at the ski club boat ramp and car parking areas, progress at Nolens Park, development of the streetscape plan, etc all support the good work of our committees and help to make our town more attractive and inviting to visitors. The new 'RV friendly' rating and relocation of the official 'Tourism Information Centre' to Boort Emporium are also very important steps in making Boort visitor friendly. The quality and management of our events over the past year has been very impressive. We have now developed a well planned and focussed 'calendar of events' which allows us to be organised as a committee, as well as publicising all future activities and events to the wider community.

Our second 'Luncheon by the Lake' was a roaring success. The combination of a new location, beautiful weather and outstanding food provided the perfect ingredients for a spectacular event. The committee has decided to increase the price of the event for this year to ensure it is financially viable and actually starts to make some money for our group. It was also very pleasing to receive a sizeable community grant from the Loddon Shire to assist us with the purchase of chairs, umbrellas and other hospitality items which can be used at most of

The inaugural 'Twilight Music & Market by the Lake' was a terrific success, despite the weather and last minute relocation to Boort Park. The attendance figures and general feedback from both attendees and stall holders was extremely positive and has encouraged us to continue with the event going forward. The first 'Easter Market by the Lake' was also a success and will continue on again in 2016. Other successful events for the year included the Christmas Festival, Sculpture by the Lake Competition and the launch of the Naturally Loddon Festival at Piccoli's on Fathers Day.

I feel that we have not had the time, nor the resources, to devote to the 'business' side of our committee. Now that our events seem to be running smoothly I believe we should concentrate on improving and re-energising the business sector in Boort. The hospitality businesses play a vital role in our town, especially in attracting visitors, so we should consider our support of these businesses a priority when developing our goals for this year. I would also like to see our committee implement a strong 'shop locally campaign', as well as finalise the long discussed BBTC 'business membership'.

The combination of hard work by our committee members and successful event management has seen the BBTC prosper financially this year. It is pleasing to have some money in our account which provides the freedom to make decisions and plan events without financial restriction (to a certain extent). This has also allowed us to invest in a commercial popcorn machine which will make its debut appearance at the Boort Show. No doubt this will be a popular addition at all of our events and will no doubt provide a small but steady income stream for BBTC.

I would like to sincerely thank each and every member of my committee for their tireless efforts and support throughout the year. I am proud of all your work and our achievements as a team. Thank you to everyone for attending our meetings, for your ideas, help at our events, on the bar, on the gate, picking up rubbish – wherever help is needed there is usually someone there!! I do hope that I am able to set a good example and inspire all of our members as much as possible. I am passionate about this great town and will continue to drive this team to ensure the growth and development with both business and tourism is thriving in Boort.

Our committee faces large challenges going forward. There are many goals for our small group to achieve over the coming year, with minimal volunteers – most of whom are already over committed and time poor. 
