Father's Day at Piccoli's

Tools in numbers Dad would never dream of – used in ways he couldn't imagine.

That's the promise contained in a special event coming up soon near Boort, when John and Sonia Piccoli open their famed sculpture gardens for a Father's Day picnic.

The outing on September 6 will serve as the springboard for the 2015 "Naturally Loddon" Spring Festival, seven weeks of family-friendly events designed to showcase the best of the region's natural attractions.

Located at Barraport, the Piccolis' property will be open from 11:00am, with a gourmet barbecue operating and food and drinks on sale. Entry is \$5.00, under 18 free. Local market stalls, a bar and afternoon tea are also available.

The festival program also includes the ever-popular Kooyoora Wildflower Show, family days at Terrick Terrick National Park and Tarnagulla, a fishing competition, wetlands tour, photographic shows and field trips, an archery open day, three local festivals and Boort's Luncheon by the Lake.

One-time farmer John Piccoli makes all his metal sculptures out of spanners.

John contracted polio when he was eight and spent the next three years in hospital. When his father died, John, at 18, took up the reins and ran the family farm from his wheelchair with the help of his mother.

Visitors to the property enter via one of two avenues lined with 85 pieces of vintage farm machinery to stroll through two acres of manicured gardens awash with seasonal colours and admire the macaws, pheasants, peacocks and guinea fowl.

"Last financial year, we doubled our visitor numbers to 7150," John said.

"We have about 45 sculptures on display, ranging from fruit bowls and table centrepieces to the biggest – a full-size wagon with a Clydesdale pulling it.

Managing Queensland Fruit Fly (QFF) in your Fruit Trees and Vegetable Garden

QFF has made its presence in Boort and district for the last two years, now is the correct time to take action as very few QFF survive winter as they originated from warmer climates. There is no need to get rid of your fruit trees or veggies if you are prepared to carry out good QFF hygiene and protein spot spray. It is important that the community works together at the start of Spring to keep the QFF at very low numbers.

Cathie and I had QFF in our apricots at the beginning of the year, then carried out the proper hygiene and the rest of our plums, peaches, apples, pears, grapes and citrus trees were virtually free of QFF.

For Boort to have good QFF control we need volunteers to visit properties in Boort to help control QFF, if anyone can help, please ring me. Residents who are interested in QFF control on their property can ring or before visiting us by phoning 0417 333 171, you will be able to see how Cathie and I have controlled our QFF problem.

Adult flies are about seven millimetres long, reddish-brown in colour with distinct yellow markings. The females sting the fruit as it is ripening where the maggots develop and pupate in the soil under the tree developing into adult QFF, once again. QFF only mate and lay eggs once, then die.

The QFF creamy white maggots are approximately five to ten millimetres long, found when the fruit is cut open. The maggots can be identified by their jumping action when touched.

The first step in control is to monitor by trap counts, Male Annihilating Technique Cups, known as MAT CUPS, these contain a powerful attractant for male QFF with a rapid kill insecticide. Place at head height in the tree, traps can be purchased at local chemical or home garden retailers.

The second step is to apply a protein bait spray, the females must feed on protein before they can sting the fruit. It is best to spot spray the east side of the trunk or some of the leaves or even a board and placed near the fruit tree. This is by far the most effective way to control QFF, spray should be applied in large droplets to make it easier for the QFF to feed on. QFF traps are mainly for monitoring and do not control QFF. It is important to use protein bait sprays to achieve the results needed.

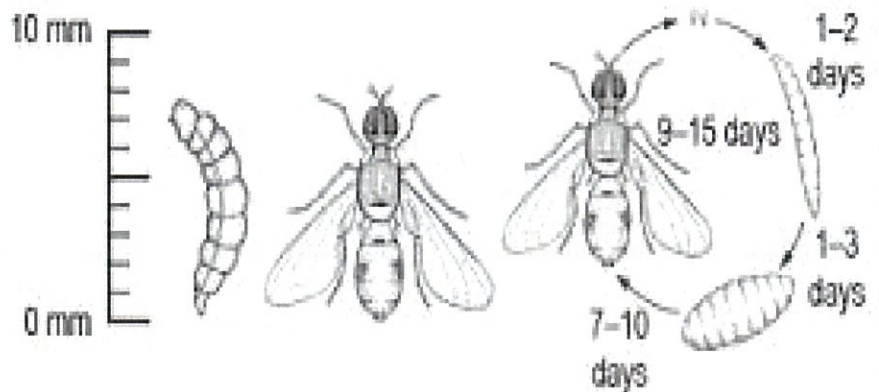
Traps are also important and can be purchased from the sources mentioned above or you can make your own out of soft drink or milk plastic containers. Drill four holes 100mm from the top, approximately the size of a ten cent coin, hang in the shade of the tree, preferably on the north side, pour in approximately one cup of QFF attractant, being careful not to spill on the outside of the bottle.

There are other simple methods to use to have healthy fruit. Cover fruit trees with mosquito netting or a similar material and tie at the trunk so that the fruit fly hatching cannot affect the fruit. Another method is to put sleeves of mosquito netting over the fruit. Some people use cheap gazebos to protect their veggies and fruit. Chooks under the trees, with their continual scratching and eating the fallen fruit help prevent the larvae from hatching. It is important to prune trees to a manageable height and to collect fallen fruit and place in a black plastic bag, leaving in the sun to cook.

Tennis Season starts on Saturday 17th October. Once again, Junior and Senior Tennis will take place on Saturday afternoons.

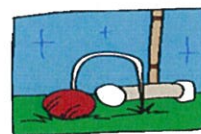

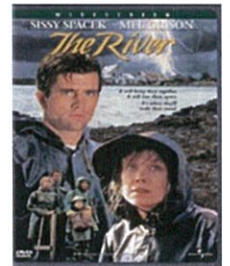
