



A big thank you from Parks Victoria to everyone who attended the Open House drop-in consultation at BRIC on Friday 13 and Saturday 14 November. It was very valuable for the planning team to hear the different ideas and issues for the future management of the reserve from a wide range of people. The insights from people who have known Lake Boort over many years helped to provide a longer term perspective for the planning.

The survey invites you to comment on the draft vision for the lake; what the priorities for management should be; and what activities should be allowed or restricted. The Battle of Long Tan Anniversary – student study tour

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh has encouraged students of the Murray Plains electorate who will study Year 10 or 11 in 2016 to enter the Vietnam War *History Competition*. "As the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Long Tan approaches, it is timely to encourage local students to learn more about the Vietnam war and reflect upon the spirit of those brave young Australian men conscripted to fight," Mr Walsh said.

The Vietnam War History Competition encourages young people to explore the topic of the Vietnam War and the issues that prompted debate amongst a nation. "Students can make written submissions, or enter craft or audio visual projects," Mr Walsh said. The winning entrants will take part in a study tour to Vietnam to visit Australia's key battle fields, as well as places of historical significance in Ho Chi Minh, Saigon and Hanoi.

Entries close on March 27 2016 and travel will take place in September 2016.

Loddon Shire Closures:

The Council offices in Wedderburn and Serpentine will close at noon on Wednesday 23 December for the afternoon. The offices will then be closed from noon Thursday 24 December 2015 and reopen at 8:15am on Monday 4 January 2016.

The Community Services Department will also be closed from noon Thursday 24 December 2015 and reopen at 8:15am on Monday 4 January 2016. Limited personal care will be provided and clients will be advised of their personal care services for this period. There will be limited Meals on Wheels provided and clients will be contacted to arrange meals for this period. No home care, respite care or property maintenance services will be offered over this time.

For any client service requirement emergencies during this period, phone 0427 804 736.

Kerbside garbage and recycling collections scheduled for Friday 25 December will move to Sunday 27 December, and collections scheduled for Friday 1 January will move to Sunday 3 January.

Landfills and Transfer Stations will be closed on Friday 25, Saturday 26 and Monday 28 December 2015, Friday 1 January 2016, and Tuesday 26 January 2016.

Night Network

Night Network, a one year trial of all-night public transport, was announced by the Minister for Public Transport Jacinta Allan recently.

The trial includes 24-hour public transport in Melbourne on Friday and Saturday nights, and a 2:00 am V/Line coach service to major regional towns starting on 1 January 2016.

The V/Line service will be called "Night Coach" and will provide a new late-night service to the major regional centres of Ballarat, Bendigo, Traralgon and Geelong. The services will depart Southern Cross Station at around 2:00 am.

V LINE

Coaches will pick up and drop off at major stations, and drop off at smaller stations on request. Timetables and more information about the V/Line services will be available in the coming weeks.

Public transport in Melbourne will run all night on the weekends and will be serviced by Night Train, Night Bus and Night Tram.

Night Network will provide options for people travelling to and from work during the night, and provide better access to the city and nightlife.

Patronage and demand will be closely monitored during the trial and the initiative will be reviewed after the 12 months. You can't tell if a tradesperson is dodgy just by how they look, but there are some things you can look out for.

Be suspicious of people who:

- · knock on your door unexpectedly
- · offer cheap deals for 'today only'
- · ask for cash up front
- offer to drive you to the bank to get money for payment
- · pressure you to accept their offer.

Who are travelling con men?

Travelling con men are dodgy tradesmen who knock on doors of homes and small businesses, offering to do maintenance work.

They appear more frequently during warmer weather and after natural disasters, such as floods, fires and storms, when vulnerable people are cleaning up or repairing their properties.

Travelling con men offer to do jobs such as drive way resurfacing, painting, roof repairs and carpet cleaning at a cheap rate. Often they pressure people offering "today only" specials

Why Should you avoid them?

Travelling con men ask for cash before starting work and frequently disappear as soon as you pay them. If they do any work it is often unfinished or of a poor standard. They move quickly and usually only give a first name and mobile number—so contacting them afterwards is difficult.

A practical website has been developed to help central Victorian residents prepare themselves and their homes to beat extreme heat during the summer months.

Loddon Shire Council Mayor Gavan Holt said heatwaves which were increasing in frequency and severity throughout Australia, presented a serious health threat and in the most extreme cases could be fatal.

"While all people can be affected by heatwaves, without a doubt the most vulnerable group is the elderly," Cr Holt said.

Loddon Shire Council Mayor Gavan Holt said he would also encourage family, friends and neighbours to help those most at risk to access or action information contained on the new

website, which contained a host of useful tips about keeping cool during the summer months.

Suggestions for keeping cool

- drinking water
- dressing for the weather
- going somewhere cool
- staying in the shade
- reducing physical activity
- looking after your pets,
- going shopping before it gets too hot
- ♦ calling 000 when you're not feeling well





Better managing the home environment also plays an important part in maintaining health during heatwaves. Homes heat up for a number of reasons and these reasons may vary according to the direction your home faces

Keeping your home cooler ideas

- ♦ keeping windows and blinds closed until it cools down outside,
- reducing drafts and zoning off areas
- putting external blinds on your sunniest windows,
- ensuring there are thick curtains on windows,
- taking the time to draught seal gaps and cracks
- looking ahead to shade windows by planting trees



"The Heatwave Action website gives great advice on how to beat the heat through simple home improvements and managing our health and living spaces."

"If we focus on just one action associated with each general piece of advice it can help make a difference in ensuring we are comfortable during the hot summer months."

Cr Holt said residents living within Loddon Shire Council often experienced very hot weather and Council's health and wellbeing teams wanted to ensure everyone, especially our elderly and vulnerable, survive the harsh conditions.

"If you are not able to log onto the internet, find someone who can assist you and then make the changes you can," he said.

BOORT DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Our key achievements during the past year: The Boort Development Committee (BDC) is creating a metal sculpture trail around the lake.

Moz Moresi's wonderful metal sculpture "The Dragon Fly" was installed on a large log beside the board walk, becoming the first installation of the trail. The Sculpture Workshops sponsored by BDC and directed by Moz Moresi created "Rusty the Redfin". "Rusty" has been placed by the lake near the Boort Tennis Clubhouse and is much admired by locals and tourists alike.

John and Sonia Piccoli have donated a towering spanner seat structure which has been installed at the eastern end of the Federation Walk. A large granite rock which has been shipped from Switzerland will be placed nearby with a plaque telling the story of the Piccoli migration to Australia during the Gold Rush era. A much smaller spanner seat also donated by John and Sonia will be placed around a nearby tree in Nolens Park.

The 2015 Sculpture Workshops produced a large Cormorant which is not quite complete. It will stand on a big rock as the next part of the sculpture trail. This trail will become a major tourist attraction, complementing the unique Piccoli Star Spanner Sculpture Gardens. John and Sonia's gardens attracted 7,000 visitors last financial year; an amazing achievement!

The Metal Sculpture competition at the 2015 Boort Show was again a great crowd pleaser with \$4,000 in prize money attracting a widespread response. Thanks to Moz Moresi for judging the competition.

The redevelopment of Nolens Park is a work in progress. The cement path and some gardens have been completed and the shelters at the playground are almost complete. The next stage will be installation of furniture into the shelters, new playground equipment, and tree planting.

Loddon Shire has agreed to upgrade Federation Walk including new light towers; the project value is \$26,000. The Shire will also rebuild the steep gutters on the north side of Godfrey Street to make it more user-friendly. Pedestrian crossings will be constructed around the intersections of Godfrey and Lakeview Streets, improving disabled access.

Boort has become an RV Friendly Town with the installation of a dump site at Boort Park. BDC assisted with site works. This is a very important advance as many more caravans now visit Boort and spend time and money here. From 24th April to 13th May, Paul Haw exhibited his unique Vietnam War photo collection in the Atrium at St John of God Hospital in Bendigo. The exhibition was a great success with donations going to the BDC.

BDC (with Paul Haw's advice) built a small tower at the entrance to The Patch at Boort District School. The bricks were taken from the gateway to the old Primary School. The tower is being used as a site to mount various plaques explaining past and present school history. Honie Tweddle and Jennie Weaver, via the Boort Historical Society, have secured the last two Historic Towers which have been installed by BDC. The nine Towers along Godfrey Street now provide a permanent record of Boort's entire history.

BDC has become concerned about wave erosion to the shores of Little Lake Boort. So a retaining wall has been built at the end of the boardwalk and hay bales placed on the edge beyond that. Reeds have been planted to further protect that edge. The Committee is working with the Shire to allow the lawn grass to grow over the lake edge and reduce wave erosion.

Congratulations to Kathryn Lanyon and the Boort Business and Tourism Council for their hard work and achievements during the year. My personal thanks and congratulations to the members of BDC. The group possesses many extraordinary skills enabling all sorts of projects to be tackled. Special thanks to Secretary Rod and Treasurer Alister.
