This year is shaping up to be one of the best grain production years for local farmers. By Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> December the local Grain Co-operative had accumulated 100,000 tonnes of wheat and barley. It is coming in at around 6,000 tonnes a day keeping the site very busy at all times. So far turnaround times have been kept at a reasonable level and Gary Wilson and his team of workers are doing a great job. The Co-op has provided a lot of employment for local young people over the harvest.

Good spring weather meant that it was a late start to the harvest, most starting the last week of November. One farmer took his son around the crops and said "Have a good look, because you won't see crops like this again in your lifetime".

Our roads are very busy at the moment with a lot of grain trucks on the go so please be careful out there.

## Patience will pay dividends for road network

I understand some residents may be feeling frustrated at what feels like band aid repair measures following the September and October flooding events.

“Why can’t Council fix the damage properly in the first instance?” could be a question you ask yourself as you travel over temporary safety measure work and wind your way around another road safety warning sign.

But a small delay in having the job properly repaired may be just the thing which leads to us having better roads in the long run.

Council has completed the vast majority of work required to make your journey safe, but now has to wait for an anticipated \$10 million in flood restoration funding to flow through.

If our crews move beyond the scope of emergency response measures, they could potentially jeopardise an additional source of funding Council should qualify for under the flood restoration program – all the while eating into the annual road maintenance budget.

Council’s Director Operations anticipates the additional pool of flood recovery money will be delivered ready for full repair work to begin within the first quarter of 2017.

Please continue to exercise patience, especially over the Christmas / New Year period.

In the meantime, Council crews will continue to assess road damage which has directly or indirectly been caused by the flooding events, ahead of delivery of the multi-million dollar flood restoration package which will reward our community for its patience.

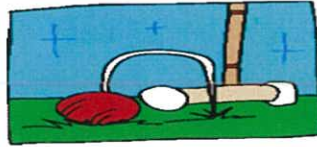

## Trailrider All – Terrain Wheelchair

A world - leading all-terrain wheelchair that allows people with limited mobility to explore otherwise inaccessible bush trails has arrived in Loddon Shire.

The device is a cross between a wheelbarrow and sedan chair that allows several helpers to guide the passenger – adult or child – along outdoor tracks and trails.

It weighs 25kg, but can be easily dismantled to slide into the back of a large car.

Invented in Canada in the early 1990s, the TrailRider was brought to Australia by Parks Victoria.

There are officially now 14 in Victoria and six more scattered around the rest of the country.

Tourism and marketing officer for Loddon Shire Robyn Vella said Council had established 12 walking trails around the municipality for people to enjoy.

“We have a number of specific trails we will recommend for TrailRider users, but the experienced staff and volunteers at the Visitor Centre can offer up-to-date information and guidance,” Mrs Vella said.

“There are some beautiful scenic tracks for all abilities around Boort, Bridgewater, Inglewood, Pyramid Hill, Tarnagulla and Wedderburn.”

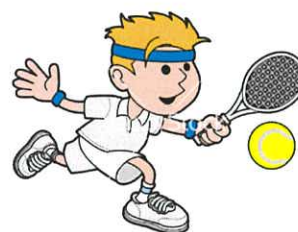

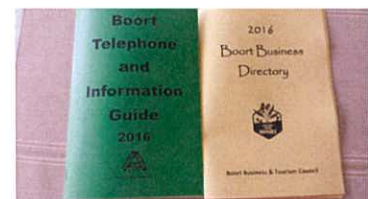

## **Festive Season Free Travel and 2017 Fare Adjustment**

On Christmas Day, Sunday 25 December 2016, public transport will be free from the first to the last service on all metropolitan trains, trams, buses, V/Line train and coach services and regional town bus services.

Travel on all V/Line train and coach services where boarding occurs after 6:00pm on Saturday 31st December will be free.

Most V/Line fares will increase by an average of 3.9% from 6:00am on Sunday 1st January 2017.

From 30th January 2017, the age range for children will be 5 to 18 inclusive.

Customers aged 17 and 18 will now be eligible to travel on a child myki and pay a concession fare provided they carry identification.

School and tertiary institution issued ID cards are not accepted as proof of concession entitlement.

Children aged four years and under will travel for free and do not need to carry a myki.
