## Boort Swimming Pool 50<sup>th</sup> Celebrations



On Sunday 12th March, one of Boort's major facilities celebrated its 50<sup>th</sup> birthday. Loddon Shire Mayor, Cr Neil Beattie presented a plaque to Honie Tweddle (life member of the Boort Swimming Club) and Deanne Smith (pool manager) recognising the milestone, which will be installed at the pool's entrance beside the 'pool opening plaque'. Honie spoke historically of a community who had a passion to build an Olympic sized pool after the Melbourne Olympics stirred interest in the town members. She highlighted that the many volunteers who fund raised, donated their labour, provided trucks to move soil, donated grain, was an amazing community effort. Overall, residents contributed \$21,081 towards the \$58,342 project. Past pool managers in attendance reminisced of their days in charge – Carmel Allison and Joy De Piazza spoke of the hours of 'dunny cricket' the young boys would play, double bouncing on the diving board and the 'money tins'. Current pool manager Deanne Smith spoke of the upgrades in facilities and the positive partnership with United Community Sports and Leisure and the Loddon Shire, who truly see the pool as an asset to our community.

'Lilyvale Catering' provided a scrumptious hot roast meat roll tea and the 180 that gathered were in awe of the 'birthday cake' created by Wendy Last. To conclude the celebration everyone joyously sang Happy Birthday to the pool and the cake was cut by past pool managers, Carmel Allison, Joy De Piazza, Jerri Nelson and current pool manager, Deanne Smith. Tamara Boyd with the assistance of Brooke Chamberlain created a Celebration Booklet that was viewed on the night. On Sunday 2 April 2017, Daylight Saving Time (EDST) will cease in Victoria when at 03:00 clocks will be put back to show 02:00.

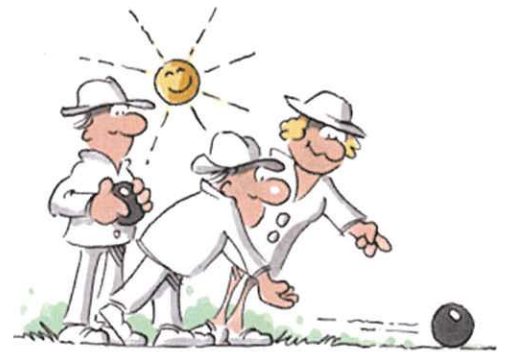
### Boort Bowls Club

## About the Buloke Loddon L2P program:

The Buloke Loddon Learner Driver Mentor Program aims to help learner drivers from 16 to 21 years of age, who do not have access to the usual support needed to gain 120 hours of supervised learner driving experience required to obtain a provisional licence.

The program does this by matching trained volunteer mentors from the community with learner drivers; provide a vehicle and fuel, Professional driving instructor lessons and support from local coordinators

## What do Mentors do?

Mentors are community members who volunteer their time to pass on their experience and skills by supervising and mentoring young people during driving sessions. VicRoads trains all mentors in the role of Supervising Drivers, how Young Drivers learn and how to get the most from each driving session.

Mentor Driving supervision *are not professional driving lessons* – they are more like a regular driving session Learners may expect if they were in the vehicle with a family friend or relative, you may have even supervised learner driver's before, in a similar coaching style of learning.

## Who are the Learner Drivers?

Learner Drivers are young people (16 – 21) from the Buloke and Loddon Shires who do not have the usual supports needed to get their driver's licence. They come from a diversity of backgrounds and situations. All want to increase their life opportunities by gaining their driver's licence.

## How to get involved:

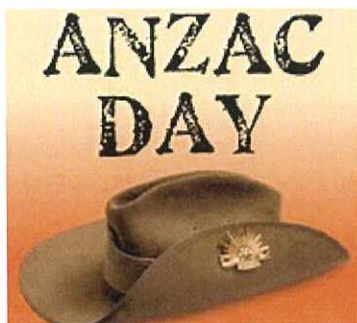

## BOORT R.S.L. 2016-2017 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We have had quite a successful year with no losses. Membership remains at 20 consisting of 12 service members and 8 affiliate members. 8 of our service members are WWII Veterans, the youngest 91 years old and the eldest 96 years old. However, only 2 of those 8 are actively involved and only 1 Vietnam Veteran is a member. Boort was fortunate that only a small number of young men were called up during the years of the Vietnam War.

Two of our members attended the Fire Brigade Presentation Dinner on the 19<sup>th</sup> March 2016, and enjoyed it. This year marked 100 years since the R.S.L was formed by Veterans of Gallipoli and France who were invalided home as unfit for military service. The lesser disabled cared for the more seriously disabled and so established the tradition of the R.S.L. which continues to this day: our first care is for the welfare of our less fortunate comrades.

The 2016 Anzac Day service was very well attended, largely because of the Centenary of R.S.L. Our numbers were swelled by a group of Veterans Australia wide who meet each Anzac day to attend the Anzac Day Service at one of the smallest places they can find on the map. They were very welcome and made the number of marchers more impressive. They were happy with their visit to Boort and appreciated the fly-over by a couple of local lads in their war birds. Thank you Jamie and Adam. We always enjoy it also.

Bill Slatter was our speaker. He and his wife Annette had previously visited France and Belgium to find the graves of 25 Boort men who died in W.W.I. they were not totally successful, so went back last year and found the last of them. They found the last one in a small cemetery in a farmer's paddock. Other visitors to the cemetery realised their elation at the completion of their quest and joined them in placing poppies on the grave – a moving experience for all of them.

Members of the Women's Auxiliary, Fire Brigade and locals marched with us. The junior choir provided an item at the service. It was lovely, and they were 85 to 90 years younger than a few of us.

Our Women's Auxiliary, celebrated their 70<sup>th</sup> birthday on 24<sup>th</sup> June. There was a good attendance and they were delighted to receive a letter of congratulations and appreciation from the State President R.S.L. In August their Vice President Thelma Powell celebrated her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday. This was recognised by people in high places as you would expect. An added thrill was receipt of a Certificate of Service and a letter of best wishes from the State President.

Our Anzac appeal raised \$2,991. We were grateful for the help of several volunteer collectors.

Diggers Day Bowls raised	\$389
Anzac Day Collection	\$500
Melbourne Cup Sweep	\$400

Our funds were in a healthy state. We were able to donate \$300 each to the Boort Memorial Hall, Boort District Health, and Boort Cemetery Trust.

Anzac Appeal money went to Anzac House as did the Poppy Appeal Collection of \$1,762. Diggers Day Golf raised \$541 for Bendigo Legacy who also benefited by \$1,484 from Legacy Week.

This money was all raised from the Boort district – impressive support for the welfare of veterans of all past and present wars and conflicts. Loddon Shire presented each R.S.L. in the Shire with a book made up of impressions of Anzac by children of the Shire – bless them, it will be a valuable addition to our small library.

## Murray to Moyne

The Murray to Moyne Bicycle relay ride is a fundraising event where participants raise money for their local health service. Riders start on a Saturday morning at the Murray River in Echuca, and ride continuously, in a relay, arriving at Hamilton late Saturday night or in the early hours of Sunday morning for a short break. Early the next morning, riders continue their journey to finish in Port Fairy, the end of the Moyne River, a total of 520 km.

The Boort cycling team have completed the ride successfully for the last 8 years raising over \$150,000 for Boort District Health. This year's team consists of locals Kathryn Velleley, Lawrence Cameron, Deanne Smith, Bayley Fuller and Finn Poxon; Jamie Ison, Barry Crockett and Roy Daykin from Wycheproof and a Melbourne team of riders, all with Boort connections. The riding team is supported by Lynette Clark, Harvey Poxon, Keenan Velleley, Samantha Isaac, Guy Conterino, Kelvin and Carol Ritchie.

The team have been training for the last six weeks and have another two of training scheduled around Boort and nearby townships. The dates for this year's ride are April 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> with the team expected in Boort on Saturday April 1<sup>st</sup> between 12pm and 2pm. Local residents are encouraged to help cheer on the team as they change over at Nolen's Park.

Leading up to the ride the team will be selling raffle tickets and seeking sponsorship. Raffle prizes include \$500 cash, donated by Jetts, an accommodation package at Yackandandah Holiday Park donated by long time support team of Ched and Janine Doyle and a variety of other prizes.

Raffle tickets can be purchased from any of the M2M riders or support crew, at Boort District Health and Boort Medical Centre. The Murray to Moyne team are seeking sponsorship and donations, which are tax deductible.

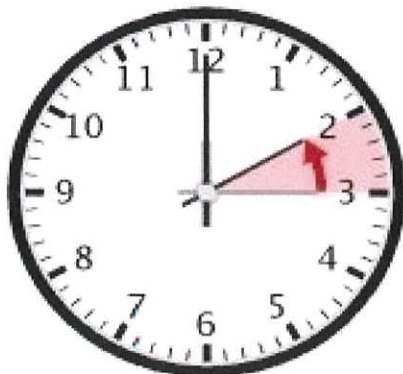
