





Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh is calling for nominations of local women to the Victorian Honour Roll of Women for 2017

Mr Walsh said the Women's Honour Roll, established in 2001, celebrates the achievements of Victorian women in a wide range of fields including women from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, aboriginal women, women with a disability, and younger, regional and rural women.

"It's a tremendous pleasure to call for **local** nominations for the Victorian Honour Roll of Women for 2017," Mr Walsh said.

"It is important that we recognise and celebrate women in our rural and regional communities who are making extraordinary contributions through their vision, leadership, commitment and hard work," he said.

Mr Walsh said more than 600 Victorian women have been inducted onto the roll since 2001.

"If people know of a local woman who is a genuine role model through her contribution to her community then nominating her for the Victorian Honour Roll of Women is a tremendous way of saying thank you," he said.

Nominees must be either born in Victoria, have spent a considerable part of their life in Victoria or have made a significant contribution to Victoria.

Lakeview Street heavy vehicle access

Council has listened to the residents and the community of Boort regarding the restriction of heavy vehicles on Lakeview Street.

At its April meeting, Council, after considering the views of local residents, resolved in principle to undertake a study for a bypass route for heavy vehicles in Boort.

The study is expected to be undertaken by external consultants and will consider a range of options.

It will also address concerns raised by the community around the movement of heavy vehicles within the Boort shopping precinct, as well as other options put forward by residents and Council. Industry feedback and consultation with VicRoads and Goulburn Murray Water will be an integral part of the study.

A project brief for the study will be prepared and presented at the next month's Council meeting on 27 June.

Council will provide information to the community about the use of Lakeview Street once there's been further consideration of the matter

Rates instalment due 31 May

Just a reminder that the fourth instalment for rates (for residents that have chosen to use this payment option) is due by Wednesday 31 May.

Reminder notices about the instalment have been sent out, however if you haven't received your notice, please contact Council. Failure to pay your rates instalment by the due date will result in accrual of penalty interest.

Under the Local Government Act, if a property owner hasn't paid any rates after three years, Council can sell that property under the Section 181 Land Sale to recover the debt it's owed.

One of these Section 181 Land Sales will be taking place in early June, with Loddon Real Estate starting to advertise eight properties for sale. Six of these properties are vacant land, while two have houses on them. The sale will take place on Saturday 3 June at 11am at the Wedderburn Senior Citizens Centre.

Remember, if you are having difficulties in being able to pay your rates instalment, Council has a number of options available; however it is important to talk to Council first. Please contact Council on 5494 1200 to discuss payment options.

Apply now for a 2017 Community Safety Fund Grant

Looking to address a local crime issue? Community Safety Fund grants now open

Local community groups and councils are invited to apply for grants of up to \$10,000 (GST excl.) to deliver practical, local crime prevention projects.

Project ideas that may be eligible for funding include:

- improving security at community facilities by installing security equipment such as locks, vandal-proof security lighting, security screens, alarms (without video surveillance), fencing and gates.
- engaging the community in small-scale, physical improvements to make public spaces safer, such as work to improve streetscapes, parks and reserves.
- education and awareness initiatives targeting theft of and from motor vehicles, theft of personal property in public places, and residential and retail burglary.

Applications close at 4:00pm on Friday 14 July 2017. Late applications cannot be submitted.


