Boort Men's Shed Extension Complete



Members of the Boort Men's Shed are delighted with the newly completed extension to their shed. The extension, funded by the Victorian Government, adds over seventy square metres of workshop space to the existing facility.

The extension, valued at over \$32,000, is the culmination of much hard work by the Boort Men's Shed members and the financial support of the Victorian Government. Built by Streader Constructions, powered by DA Electrics, and with earthworks carried out by "Windarra", the new extension is designed to provide the men with an improved workshop facility. One that not only enhances the operational capacity of the Shed, but promotes a socially friendly and collaborative environment.

"The members are greatly pleased with the new extension and look forward to expanding their activities and community projects. They certainly welcome and appreciate the financial support of the Victorian Government, without which none of this would be possible," enthused Boort Men's Shed Co-ordinator, Wayne Pappin.

The Men's Shed, with the new extension, is home to a range of heavy wood and metal working equipment and machinery. With enhanced storage space, material for projects is readily and safely accessible. With the electric fit out complete, the extension is operational with all machinery and equipment positioned and ready for use. The extension, by creating a separate workshop and social space not only enhances safety, but also improves accessibility where overcrowding is now a thing of the past.

The members are also appreciative of the Boort Resource and Information Centre and staff for their support and valuable advice. The Men's Shed participates in a range of project work, with locals dropping in a variety of projects for repair, refurbishment or restoration at very reasonable and agreed rates. New project work is always welcome and the monies earned enable the Men's Shed to expand its range of equipment and machinery to accommodate the project needs of the community. The Boort Men's Shed operates on Tuesday and Thursday from 9:30 am until 11:30 am and all are welcome.



Members of the Boort Men's Shed are planning an Open Day in early November and will invite local dignitaries and members of the community to observe the operation of the shed and the various activities and projects the members undertake. "We want to invite all and sundry to experience the Men's Shed, its operations and the warm friendship that comes with being a member of the Boort Men's Shed" said Wayne Pappin, Boort Men's Shed Co-ordinator.

The Boort Men's Shed is a health and well-being centre, that enables its members to be actively involved in a variety of worthwhile projects/activities and come together in an atmosphere of conviviality and good humour.
