

# Boort Historical Society Inc. DID YOU KNOW?

Published in the Bendigo Advertiser Thursday 21 July 1881, THE BOORT NUGGET

Our travelling reporter says: - I have already informed you by telegram of the finding of a nugget on Monday by the children of a selector named Peterson, living near Lake Yando, about six miles from the Boort township, on the main Kerang road. They had been sent out early as usual by their parents to bring in the cows. After finding them, they started homewards, and had not proceeded far when one of the youngsters espied something bright at the foot of a tree. He started to dig it out, it being firmly embedded in the ground, and amongst the roots of the tree. After a while he extracted it, and found it was a lump of gold, with which he hurried home. Mr. Petersen took the nugget to the National Bank at the township, and found it weighed 80 ozs. How the treasure found its way to where it was found cannot be ascertained, as there is nothing in the exact neighbourhood to lead any one to the belief that it is a gold-bearing locality. The soil is black and sticky, the surface being crab-holey and thickly timbered, and generally level, the distance from Petersen's selection being about four or five miles west of the Loddon. Had it been found in the Mallee little surprise would have been felt, as it is the opinion of many experienced miners who have settled in the district that gold abounds in the Mallee, requiring only energetic prospecting to discover it in payable quantities. The distance from the nearest diggings (Wedderburn) is nearly thirty miles. Many persons in the neighbourhood think the nugget had been planted in the early days, or lost there, but this seems rather improbable, as the locality is quite out of the track of where gold was likely to be carried, and probably the exact spot had never been visited by white men until selection set in a few years ago. A few months since a quartz specimen showing gold was ploughed up by a selector at Mysia, about twelve miles from Petersen's, but in country of a similar character. This would lead one to believe that Petersen's nugget was found where nature had left it, and that there may be somewhere in the locality a rich goldfield yet to be opened. Great excitement was created in the Boort township when the find became known, and a crowd soon assembled at King's Hotel, where the nugget was to be seen.

#### Published in the Boort Standard and Quambatook Herald, Friday April 8, 1904 A STRANGE "FIND"

While working in the Boort Gypsum pits on Saturday morning a man named J. Barry picked up a "slug" of gold weighing about a quarter of a pennyweight. The gold was found at the bottom of the gypsum stratum, about two and a half feet from the surface. Mr Barry who is a miner with considerable experience in Bendigo and West Australian



fields, tested the ground but got no farther indications of gold. As the gypsum deposit is the most unlikely locality for gold, the mystery is how the "speck" in question became imbedded there.




