Talking Health....

Now that we are heading into the spring/summer season, it is time to think about your Asthma or Hayfever management.

This year is predicted to be a bad year for Asthma and Hayfever due to the amount of canola and other grasses being cropped in the area.

If you suffer from Asthma it is time to talk with your GP about the most effective medications for your condition. Keep these medications on you at all times.

Your GP can create an Asthma Action Plan so that you can be confident with your treatment. Note: All schools require students to have an updated Asthma Action plan.

Asthma Action Plan:

Mild/moderate

Minor difficulty breathing

Able to talk in full sentences

Able to walk/move around

May have cough or wheeze

Commence Asthma First Aid

Severe

Obvious difficulty breathing

Cannot speak a full sentence in one breath

Tugging in of the skin between ribs or at base of neck

May have cough or wheeze

Reliever medication not lasting as long as usual

Call Ambulance on 000 Commence Asthma First Aid Life threatening

Gasping for breath

Unable to speak or 1-2 words per breath

Confused or exhausted

Turning blue

Collapsing

May no longer have wheeze or cough

Not responding to reliever medication

Call Ambulance on 000 Commence Asthma First Aid

Only 1 in 10 Australians survive cardiac arrest. We can beat that!

At the Boort Agricultural & Pastoral Show on Saturday 14th October, 2017 Boort Ambulance Community Officers and one off-duty Charlton & District Paramedic joined forces to provided a live demonstration of a resuscitation attempt to coincide with Restart A Heart Day. In front of a gathering of approximately 50 people they demonstrated with a Resusci-Anne and AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) trainer. A handful of community members then enthusiastically stepped-up seeking guidance to actively perform CPR with AED defibrillation.

Together we can improve cardiac arrest survival rates by knowing what to do in a health emergency.

If someone is non-responsive and not breathing normally, helping is as simple as three steps:



Don't wait until the ambulance arrives. Starting CPR immediately is one of the most critical factors in whether someone survives a cardiac arrest.

For every minute that CPR is delayed, survival decreases by 10%.



There are AED's now available at various Boort sporting/community groups. AV doesn't recommend any one particular AED. Community members should research what devices are available and what sort of training, upkeep and replacement of pads/batteries before making their purchase.

AMBULANCE VICTORIA

The majority of the Boort community are aware that we no longer have CERT. The CERT responders have upgraded their skills and are now known as Ambulance Community Officers. There is no longer a CERT vehicle, instead a fully equipped ambulance.

If the 000 number is called for an emergency, an ambulance will be dispatched and our local ACO's will be alerted also (if there is a rostered crew), just like when we had CERT.

Did you know that BDH has a 2 bed Urgent Care Centre (UCC)?

However, a UCC is not an Emergency Department (ED).

It is different to an ED because:

It is not staffed with a doctor on site.

It does not offer the full suite of emergency equipment/facilities that larger organisations such as Bendigo Health has.

The BDH UCC is staffed with qualified Registered Nurses 24 hours a day, every day of the year.

It is supported by St Anthony's and the Boort Medical Clinic by ON CALL visiting medical officers (VMO's) on a roster basis either in person or over the phone.

What does this mean?

There is a qualified nurse on duty every single day, every single shift, every day of the year, who can see you and assess you if you present to BDH UCC feeling unwell or injured.

There are VMO's on call at all times who will be consulted over the phone regarding your care and will either give advice and medical orders over the phone to the nurse treating you OR they will assess you and consult with you via Telehealth OR they will come in and see you face to face in our UCC.

What is Telehealth?

Telehealth is a mobile unit that staff can use to connect with the VMO. You will see them in real time on the monitor and they will see you on their device (either phone or iPad). They can chat with you, ask you questions, see your concerns and make assessments and plan for your care via this method.

If you phone BDH for advice and are advised to present to UCC or if you present to UCC in person by your own means or you are brought to UCC by Ambulance Victoria, our nurses on duty will triage you.

What does TRIAGE mean?

The Australasian Triage Scale is used universally across ALL public UCC's and ED's in Victoria.

It is a system whereby you are assessed according to the severity of the illness that you present with and the urgency of medical intervention that you require.

Based on what you tell the nurse and how they assess things about you such as your heart rate, your blood pressure, your level of consciousness, your ease of breathing etc., you will be assigned a TRIAGE CATEGORY SCALE ranging between 1 and 5.

BDH is classified as a Level 0-1 public health care facility. What this means in our UCC is that if you are Triaged as a Cat 1 or 2, you will only stay at BDH long enough to be stabilised and appropriate transport will be arranged for you to go to a larger health facility such as Bendigo Health.

Australasian Triage Scale	Acuity (time to be seen by nurse)	Code	Examples
Resuscitation	Immediately	1	Unconsciousness, shock, multi-trauma
Emergency	Within 10 minutes	2	Severe pain, dyspnoea, altered consciousness
Urgent	Within 30 minutes	3	Abdominal pain, minor fracture, infections
Semi-urgent	Within 1 hour	4	Minor trauma
Non-urgent	Within 2 hours	5	Chronic conditions

Harvest roaduse feedback

Loddon Shire Council is asking producers from across the municipality to provide information regarding what gravel roads they plan to use for this season's harvest. This is to help Council prepare its gravel road network for the expected increase in heavy vehicles and traffic during the coming months. Loddon Shire Mayor Neil Beattie said by providing information now, producers would be able to assist Council in planning for grading and maintenance works to the gravel roads.



"By getting the information now regarding what producers are planning for this year's harvest, Council will be helped enormously in planning its grading and maintenance works beforehand. This will make sure specific roads that are expected to be heavily trafficked during harvest are ready for use."

Council is asking producers what gravel roads will need to be used, how many truck movements and tonnes are expected, and roughly what dates they will be transporting for harvest. "I understand that the use of certain roads, time periods and how many truck movements required during harvest season can change from year-to-year," Cr Beattie added.

Cr Beattie said that Council recognised that some flood impacted roads required maintenance before they were fully restored.

"Council will be appointing contractors to undertake maintenance works on roads seriously impacted by the 2016 flooding, with the view to making these roads safe for the upcoming harvest season before full restoration works are completed," he said. "Contractors are expected to be on board by the end of the month."

In addition, Council has put out for tender the major contract for flood damage restoration works for sealed and unsealed road repairs; this tender was advertised from the end of last month.
