





Harvest Report from Boort Co-op



The Boort Grain Co-op is having another successful harvest. We won't reach the heady heights of last year, but none the less tracking nicely.

It looks like the bulk of harvest will be completed by Christmas, however we do anticipate receivals to continue until mid-January. As of the 19th Dec, the Co-op has received approximately 85,000mt (100,000mt still not out of the question.)

Pleasingly, the Co-op is receiving increased support from the larger tier 1 trading companies, and

continued support from all of its long term clients.

This harvest we have had approximately twelve active trade buyers posting cash bids, in many cases at a premium to what they post across the road at Graincorp.

Bull and his team continue to provide quality service and flexibility, which are the key factors to the Co-op's success.


