Goldfields Libraries CEO Mark Hands will officially open the new space.


Acclaimed British crime writer Ann Cleeves will visit to share stories about her own illustrious writing career.



Golf News 2018

The Boort team of Dot Beattie, Di Johnston, Karen Allison with 109pts won the Freda Fawcett Silver Salver – Memorial Trophy donated by John and Sonia Piccoli.



Baby Show, Outstanding Success, Boort Standard 1938

As a result of the American Tea and Baby Show held in the Memorial Hall on Friday last, the sum of £73/12/4 was raised by the Hospital Auxiliary members under the leadership of Mrs Wood their President. The energetic and efficient secretary Mrs Bruce Weaver, had everything so well arranged that the whole proceedings were run smoothly and successfully. The afternoon tea was catered for by the members and was of special excellence the takings being £10/2/0. The Cake and American Tea stalls were also well patronised.

There were eight sections for babies up to two years and entries were received from many outlying districts. Of the 41 entrants 30 came before the Judge, Dr. Hudson of Quambatook. Sister Fieller assisted him in the difficult task of weighing, measuring and generally examining the babies. Before presenting the trophies to the winners, Dr Lidgett (who said he was more adapt at presenting babies to mothers than cup to babies) introduced Dr. Hudson to the large audience gathering eagerly awaiting the results.

Dr. Hudson said he had been faced with a very difficult task in choosing the winners from so many lovely babies and explained that the decisions were based on standard weight and development according to the age of each entrant. In each of two sections he said the results were so close that he had had to bring back two babies for a further inspection before making a decision.

The various awards were:

Boy under 6 months; Murray Balding - Girl under 6 months; Margaret Cable

Boy 6 to 12 months; Neil Nelson, Girl - 6 to 12 months; Patsy Kane

Boy 12 to 18 months; Wallace Scott, Girl - 12 to 18 months; Elinore Perry

Boy 18 months to 2 years; Barry Barnes - Girl, 18 months to 2 years; Mary Allison

The trophies were Silver Mugs four of these were donated by Mesdames A. Coutts, R. W. Jeffery, J. D. Fyfe and Mr T. Lanyon. Mrs Lidgett's Cup for the Champion Baby of the Show was won by Margaret Cable. The popular Baby Competition held in connection with the Show provided an added touch of excitement and when the winner's number of votes $2154\frac{1}{2}$ representing £30/13/7½

raised by the committee of Baby Lanyon was read out it was greeted with prolonged applause as also was that of Baby John Elliott 1190 votes representing £14/17/6. As mementoes of the occasion Mrs Wood donated a Silver Cup to the former and a Silver Porringer to the latter baby.

A FARM STORY, Weekly Times Sat 27 Mar 1926

From Thomas O'Connell, Leaghur, via Boort. We live a long way from the school and we have an old horse called Navigator. We call the gig a ship. There are six of us and we are sailors. I am a Dane because I have red hair. One boy is Captain Cook, little Don is Bass, Mick is Dampier because he has sore eyes. Bill is Flinders for he is thin. Our teacher is Grace Darling, because she pulls the little ones in before the Boat starts, our horse is a bit flash. I bought a bike with the money from my rabbit skins and I pay £1 a month. I trap my rabbits with eight traps but it is the summer now and the weevils got at 50 skins I had ready to send away. I am 12 years old and in the 5th grade.

Victorian Energy Compare will compare available offers with your current plan to see if they are higher or lower and will search every offer on the market from every Victorian energy company. It will also show you green energy offers and solar feed-in tariffs.

According to the State Government, seven out of 10 people can save money by using the Victorian Energy Compare website, with typical household saving of \$330 on energy bills in the first year alone. What's more, every household who uses the website between 1 July to 31 December 2018 will receive a \$50 Power Saving bonus.
