# *Boort Historical Society Inc. Newspaper Snippets*

## Northern District Standard October 24<sup>th</sup> 1919

Experimental Psychology "BOORT FUNNIEST THING." (By H. M. Christophers).

At 10.30 am on the 16<sup>th</sup> of April, 1919, I placed some sixty children of the Boort school three questions, which were given quite unexpectedly and without any preparation or explanation whatsoever. A quarter of an hour was given in which to answer the questions which were

What is the funniest thing about Boort?

If you had to be some grown up person in Boort who would you be and why?

If you had plenty of money, what would you do to improve Boort?

### The following were some of the answers to the first question: -

I think the lakes are the funniest things in Boort, because one is called big lake and the other the Little lake. - *May Dinner*

I think the funniest thing in Boort are the people. - *Gertie Baker*

The funniest thing about Boort is the way the ducks fall when someone shoots them. - *George Forster*

Nolen's Park because there is no Park to see. - *Mabel McLaren*

The funniest thing in Boort is old Jim dale. - *Bob Lanyon*

A black horse without a tail. - *Heather Nelson*

There are no flash houses in Boort to make it look pretty. - *Herbert Forster*

Jim Dale chasing the school children from Clement's stables. - *Bruce Weaver*

### The following were some of the answers to the second question: -

Mr Gilbert because I could keep the people and hotels in order. - *Jack Cable*

I would like to be Mr Christophers because he has only to go to school and teach children for a part of the day and then he can do what he likes. - *Rene Lackmann*

Dr Webster he is the most useful and generous. He helps to make sick people better. He is kind and goes in for sport. He shoots ducks in deep muddy water. - *Madge Gawne*

I would like to be Jack Weaver's girl because he would take you for plenty of good motor rides.

If I had to be some grown up person. I would be Mr G. Forster because I am not a woman who might get married. - *George Forster.*

I would be a shop keeper because it is easy work. - *Hyland Nelson*

### The following were some of the answers to the third question: -

I would spend the money and not hoard it up because you cannot take it with you when you die. I would make Boort a picture no artist could paint. - *Nellie Major*

I would like to give some money to make a park around the lake or build a high school.

The club also donates money to local causes such as assisting the Boort District School to pay for camps, prizes for literature competitions, etc.

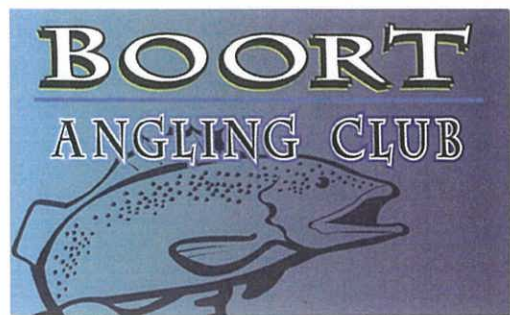

## MAYORAL COLUMN

Loddon Shire residents are encouraged to go online at [www.srcentre.com.au/ALC](http://www.srcentre.com.au/ALC) from today until June 16 to complete the Healthy Heart of Victoria 2019 Active Living Census.

The census aims to find out what people living in the Loddon Campaspe region do to keep active, what stops them from being active and what it would take for them to become more active.

Loddon Shire Mayor Cheryl McKinnon said the aim of the census is to seek local and regional data on the community's health behaviours, activity levels, preferences and needs.

A prize pool of \$12,000 is available with 84 chances to win, including a \$4,000 *Early Prize Draw* for online entries between May 20 and 26. The remaining draws for both online and hard copy entries will be open from May 27 to June 16.

The census is supported by the Victorian Government and is a part of Healthy Heart of Victoria, an initiative of the Loddon Campaspe Regional Partnership that aims to improve health outcomes for residents living in central Victoria. The census will also be delivered to more than 117,000 homes in the Loddon Campaspe region in coming weeks.

### Draft budget out for comment

Following its consideration at the April Council meeting, Loddon Shire's 2019/20 Draft Budget is now out for public comment.

The draft budget sees Council remain in a strong cash position with a small surplus and no new borrowings. It proposes a 2.5 per cent average rate rise which is in line with the State Government's Fair Go Rates System capping level.

Kerbside rubbish collection charges will increase by 2.5 per cent – this is to assist in ensuring management of waste remains cost neutral.

Hard copies are available for inspection at Council offices in Wedderburn and Serpentine as well as at post offices, resource centres and neighbourhood houses across the Shire. Written submissions to the draft budget will close at 5pm on Friday 24 May 2019.

### Did you know?

The Fire Services Property Levy (FSPL), which is an amount that appears on rates notices, is a state government levy managed on behalf of the State Government by local councils. The FSPL has a fixed and a variable component, with the rate determined yearly by the State Revenue Office. All funds collected by Council are forwarded to the State Revenue Office.
