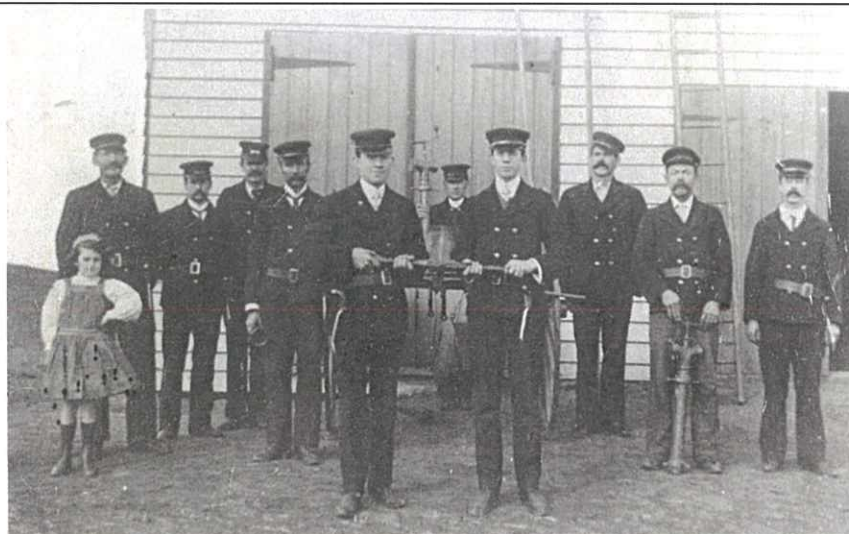
Boort Historical Society Inc. DID YOU KNOW?



Destructive Fire in Boort, Boort Standard and Quambatook Times June 1914

The residents of Boort were aroused on Monday just before midnight by the ringing of the firebell and the people flocked to the scene of the outbreak, which was found to be at Downing's Railway Terminus Hotel. Flames were leaping high out of the roof, and were spreading with rapidity all through the building. The firemen turned out promptly and soon got their appliances at work, but pressure was so poor it left them almost helpless. The firemen at once directed their energies to saving Mr W. H. Elliott's premises which were adjoining. All the valuables and much of the furniture was removed and soaked blankets were hung along the walls to prevent the building taking fire. Had this building become ignited probably the whole block would have been destroyed, as the water from the mains was practically useless. While the fire was at its height there was a terrific explosion, when an aerated gas cylinder went off with a report like a cannon, sending debris in all directions. Portions of the heavy steel cylinder was hurled through the fence which was knocked down with great force. The firemen under Captain Dinner, deserve every credit for the work they did at the fire under the most disheartening circumstances. The 4 walls of the building were of mud brick, but the whole of the inside was weather board and hessian partitions.

At 3.00am the firemen that had been left in charge of the hotel fire noticed a glare at the back of the Royal Exchange Hotel. Some went to investigate while others made for the firebell. It was discovered that a load of straw which had been placed in one of the open stable stalls the previous evening was ablaze and was burning fiercely. The flames were already running along the ridge of the building and a buggy and covered wagonette which were owned by Mr. L Waters were all alight. The firemen in the meantime were hard at the fire on the building, but after a while this was put out.

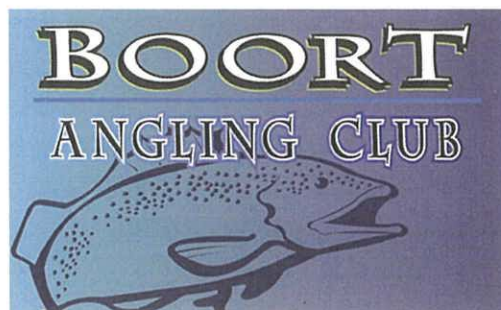

For the February Meeting of BAC we invited Boort Lake Committee to join us for a meal of fish and chips and knowledge sharing. We also invited Mr Stuart Patterson as a guest speaker. Stuart works with ESP (EQUIPMENT SOLUTIONS PLUS) who helps organisations and clubs in Sourcing & Securing Grant

Funds, Equipment Supply, Facility Upgrades, Project Management and Master Plans. This came about because of BAC intention to construct a floating pontoon (fishing platform) on the edge of the lake and straight in front of the Club House. A really good discussion finished with agreement in principal to proceed with the plans and that Stuart would proceed with the application for funding. We also need to investigate possible ways to include more fish habitat into the lake to help native fish survival rates.

Recently fisheries released 5000 Yellow Belly Fingerlings and 5000 Silver Perch fingerlings into the lake.

At Home Care Grants Available

Applications for the Youngcare At Home Care Grants in Victoria are now open. Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh is encouraging families and service providers who are caring at home for a young person with high care needs to look at this funding opportunity.

Mr Walsh said Youngcare's At Home Care Grants (AHCG) provide funding for equipment, home modifications and essential support/respite to enhance the quality of life for people aged 18-65 with high care needs, and their carers.

He said funding of \$2,000 - \$10,000 is designed to enable young people with high care needs to remain at home and avoid entering inappropriate housing.

"Examples of grants that have been approved include applications for respite care, ceiling hoists, a water-powered hydraulic lift, in-home support, a wheelchair ramp, air conditioning, power wheelchair, pressure cushion and electrical adjustable bed to name a few.

"It is important to note that individuals with out without NDIS funding can apply," Mr Walsh said.

Applications opened on 30 January 2019 and will close on 13 March 2019. Further details are available by emailing ahcg@youngcare.com.au or by phoning 1800 844 727.

Footpath construction contract awarded

At its meeting last week, Council resolved to award a contract for footpath construction projects in Boort, Mitiamo, Wedderburn, Newbridge and Bridgewater.

The works involve the construction of concrete footpaths and other associated improvements, providing an all-weather footpath and improved connectivity and safety for pedestrians. In total, 729 metres of footpath will be constructed over seven locations – Station Street and Godfrey Street in Boort, Joffre Street in Mitiamo, Lyons Street in Newbridge, Lyndhurst Street in Bridgewater and two sites along Godfrey Street in Wedderburn.
