

One hundred years ago on 11th November 1918, four bloody years of brutal conflict came to an end. Almost 62,000 Australians died fighting for our freedom and in service of our nation. Twenty-six soldiers from Boort and the surrounding districts lost their lives over the four years of conflict.

The social effects of these losses cast a long shadow over the postwar decades.

Each year on this day Australians observe one minute's silence at 11am, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wards and armed conflicts.


ARMISTICE DAY / REMEMBRANCE DAY

Northern District Standard November 14 1918 page 2

The intimation that an armistice had been concluded with Germany filtered through from various sources on Friday Morning, excitement grew and the streets of Boort were a scene of activity and animation. The fire bell told out the great tidings, flags of all dimensions were hoisted and red, white and blue bunting displayed. There were hearty hand shakes and exclamations of thanksgiving and joy were effervescent on every tongue A meeting was called and arrangements made to celebrate the occasion by a picnic in the afternoon and (contributed by the Shire President Cr. Coutts) a fireworks' display at night. All arrangements had been concluded when a – service wire to the "Standard" stated that the State Department in Washington officially denied that an armistice had not been signed. As all the arrangements had been made it was resolved to go on with the celebrations, there were other triumphs to honour. The National Anthem was sung and cheers given for the King the armies and the national leaders. The children were given a treat of fruit, soft drink and sweets as they never experienced before and in the evening a fireworks display was held on the hill.

THE REAL DINKUM NEWS

During the hours that followed every mind was filled with anticipation and was expectantly alert. It was learned that the German delegates crossed the Allied lines and news of Germany's surrender was momentary looked for. It was not however till nearly 9 o'clock on Monday night that a wire was received at this office which read: "Paris official message states that <u>armistice</u> has been signed". We at once made the news public and the musical tongue of the fire bell bore its tale of gladness to the inhabitants. Very quickly a large crowd had gathered and the reading of the telegram was the signal for a great outburst of cheering and on every hand were to be seen inspiring manifestations of joy and thankfulness. The National Anthem was lustily sung and cheer upon cheer rent the still-night's air as some fresh note in patriotic sentiment was touched. Volunteers quickly gathered material and a bonfire was lighted on the crest of the tower hill as a signal of triumph and perhaps as some said to burn the spirit of the Kaiser. In the mean time the band was brought together the firemen got into their uniforms, the ladies donned the fancy costumes worn by them at the frolic evening and these with the children and the greater portion on the populace of the town formed into procession order marching through the streets of the town with torchlights flaring and the drum sounding its rhythmic beat. Well known patriotic airs were sung and resung along the way, those who could not join in the merry marching throng cheering it as it passed. It was a memorable celebration which must leave a lasting impression on the memory of those who witnessed it. Nothing was thought out before hand and nothing prepared, it was simply the spontaneous manifestations of the feelings which were uppermost in every breast the feelings of patriotic joy, of gratitude, of thankfulness and the exuberance of racial pride.

Charges still apply for tyres, bricks and concrete and mattresses, as these items have additional third party costs associated with their disposal.



Youth Support and Advocacy Service (YSAS) outreach team work with young people aged 12-22 who are experiencing significant problems.




