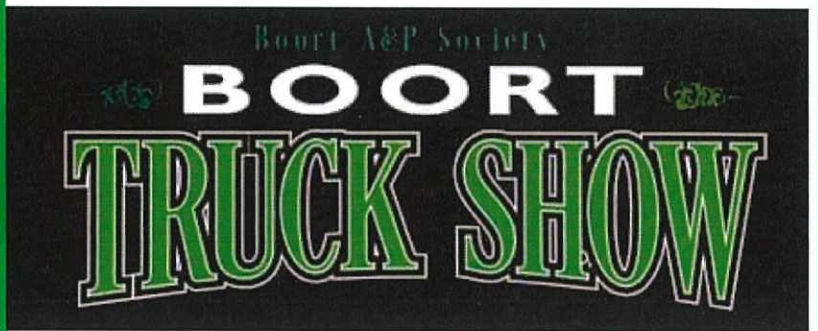


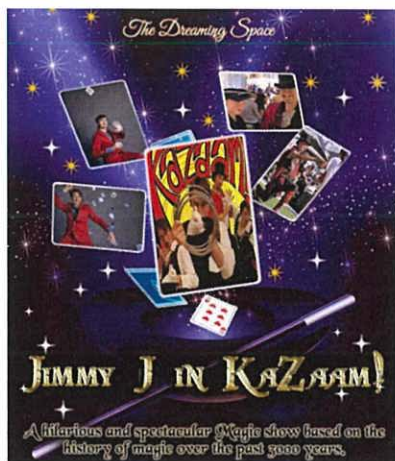

Show is Special to my Heart

For A & P Society President, Madeleine Scott, the Boort Show holds a truly special place in her heart. "I've always loved the Show," Madeleine said. "It's such a great day and a wonderful chance for people to catch up with one another. But I think it was winning Champion Local Rider in 1984 when I was eleven years old that cemented it for me. It had been a really tough year as my mum had died in the February and that was pretty hard. But Joy Manuel took me under her wing and trained me up, organized my outfit, set me up with her horse "Quest" and there I was Champion Local Rider, Boort Show 1984. I was over the moon. It was so exciting and meant so much to me at that time, still does."

These days Madeleine's own children have grown up here and enjoyed their share of fun at the Show. So on the way home from the Show last year when an exhausted but happy Millie declared "Mum I just love the Show so much," Madeleine was resolute that she needed to make a concerted effort to help the Show not only continue, but grow and thrive.

"Show Day is such a great day for our community," Madeleine said. "There's something for everyone, and this year is shaping up to be a cracker! We've got a great range of stalls booked in and rides for the kids. The students from Boort District School have been instrumental in organizing activities that they want, which is fantastic. We've got over a hundred trucks coming for the Truck Show and Shine that Heath Saunders has organized which is sensational. Then there's the Blade Shearing which is another great feature of the Show that former president Alan Wilson has been putting together. And we can't forget the ever-popular dog jumping; I'm absolutely rapt with how it's all coming together."

Something that Madeleine is extremely thankful for is how the longer serving members of the Show committee have supported the new committee in their endeavors. "They have so much knowledge and experience" Madeleine said, "We couldn't have done it without them." There is heaps of technical stuff with the Show and Marj Potter, Isabel and Ken Loader and Alan and Amanda Wilson have been a tremendous help with all of that, just amazing. I'm truly thankful for all the work that Alan Wilson as former president and all the former committee have done over the years to keep the Show alive and well, they've done a fantastic job."

With the 12th of October only a few weeks away now, the 133rd Annual Boort District Show is shaping up to be one of the best yet! I wonder who the Champion Local Rider will be this year and if they'll grow up to be Show President one day.

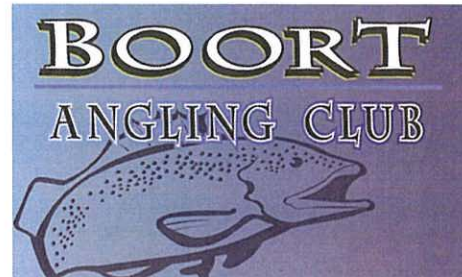
We wish to sincerely thank our sponsors and encourage you to support them.
