

Dale was also a valuable member of the Amity Club of Boort and brought about the production of the

local Rotary/Amity phone book. She is very much missed in Amity and the club

has installed a seat with a plaque in Dale's memory at Rotary Park and have donated to the Cancer Council on her behalf.

Dale McDonald was instrumental in establishing a Probus Club in Boort of which she was President.

Sadly, Dale passed away in 2010.

Her family have donated two books on New Zealand to Boort Community School library in her memory.

These books will be a great reference source for school projects and we know that Dale would want us all to enjoy learning more about New Zealand.






An interesting day was had by all and students were able to gather a great deal of photographs and information that will be used on future assessment tasks and the all-important end of year exam.

# **Boort District School Loddon Mallee Region Swimming Results**

There were eighteen Boort District School swimmers who qualified from the North Central District Swimming Sports to compete at the Loddon Mallee Region Championships held March 17<sup>th</sup> at Swan Hill pool.

In the individual events Jordan Bleicher gained a 2<sup>nd</sup> place for backstroke, Rory Grogan a 3<sup>rd</sup> for Breaststroke and Conor Grogan a 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Individual Medley. The Medley relay team of Harrison McConnell, Jordan Bleicher, Conor Grogan and Rory Grogan gained a 2<sup>nd</sup> place, and the Boys 17 years Freestyle team of Jordan Bleicher, Daniel Anderson, Will Gould and Conor Grogan came 3<sup>rd</sup>.

All the swimmers performed well against some outstanding competition from schools in the region that takes in Bendigo to Mildura to Echuca.

#### Pet registration due

Residents who have a cat or dog that hasn't been registered with Council in the past will need to contact the Shire. Pet registration is a legal requirement and animals need to be registered by the time they are three months old.

The fee this year is \$103, but pensioners pay half that. Reduced fees of \$25 (and \$12.50 concession) are available under certain conditions.

Pet owners will receive a discount if their animal has been desexed, is over 10 years of age, belongs to a domestic animal business or applicable organisation, if it's a dog that has undergone training or is a working dog.

If you no longer have a cat or dog that was registered with Council last year, you will need to contact the Shire, so we can amend our records.

Council officers can issue fines of up to \$1480 per animal if your pet is not registered.

Registrations can be paid by mail, over the phone with a credit card only or at Council agencies around the Shire.

Apart from the Council offices in Serpentine and Wedderburn, sites accepting payments are the Boort Resource and Information Centre,
