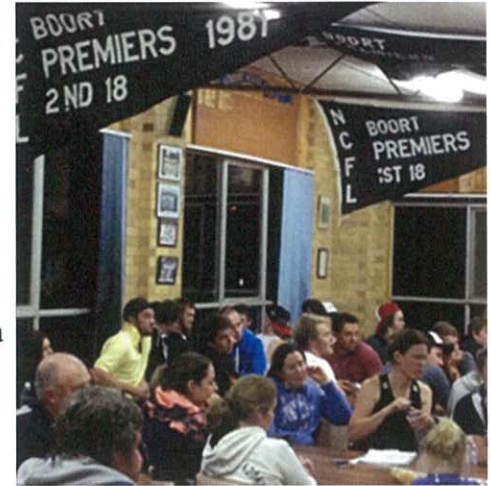
## WHAT A BIG MONTH IT'S BEEN IN FOOTY

## Successful Junior Country Championships for North Central Hockey

Last weekend saw one hundred North Central junior hockey players take to the synthetic fields across Melbourne in the Junior Country Championships. With less than two hours of training as a team behind them and some experience on the synthetic turf all teams performed admirably. A change to the competition schedule saw most teams playing between six and nine games over the weekend.

For the majority of the Under 13 girls this was their first experience playing on turf and in a full pitch round robin competition. They were supported by 3 Kerang players and despite their young age they competed strongly, with skill improvement evident. They had many close encounters and finished the competition in 8<sup>th</sup> position.

It was fantastic to see two Under 15 Girls teams enter the competition with the assistance of some girls from the Kerang Junior Hockey Club. One team won 3 games and drew in another 2, while the other team finished with a couple of wins. The teams finished fifth and seventh in a very strong competition.

The Under 17 Girls had a successful campaign, winning 6 games, drawing 1 and losing the other. In the grand final against Sunraysia they fought back to end the game in a 1 all draw. Penalty flicks ensued to decide who would be declared the winner. North Central once again showed spirit and won in a nail biting ending.

The Under 13 Boys competition was separated into 2 pools with North Central positioned in Pool A. They were undefeated on day 1 and followed up with a draw with Albury Wodonga on day 2. In the Grand Final they played against Albury Wodonga for the third time and won 2 – 1.

The Under 15 Boys team comprised mostly of players from the last three successful campaigns. In the 8 games leading up to the grand final they remained undefeated. They were unstoppable in the grand final against Goulburn Valley winning 4-0.

The Under 17 Boys had a mixed campaign winning 2, drawing 1 and losing 4. They had many close tussles and were unfortunate not to have won another couple of games. The team finished fifth in the tournament.

Congratulations to all players who took part in this weekend. Their behaviour, teammanship and manners were to be proud of. Many lasting friendships are forged from weekends such as these. A huge thank you to coaches, umpires, team managers, bus drivers and parent helpers, without your assistance such a positive and exciting weekend would not be possible. As all the work is done on a volunteer basis, helpers will be needed on the course, with cleaning up the bunkers, sands and around the general area including the Clubhouse.

## Loddon Shire Draft Budget Released

Council has released its draft budget for 2015-16 for public comment. Copies of the Draft Budget will be available for inspection from Monday 18 May 2015 to Monday 15 June 2015 at the Shire Offices Wedderburn and Serpentine between 8:15am and 4:45pm and at post offices, resource centres and neighbourhood house premises within the municipality. The Draft Budget can also be accessed on Council's website at: <http://www.loddon.vic.gov.au/Our-documents/Financial-reports/Budget>.

It will include a proposed roads, streets, bridges, and drainage capital works program of \$4.8 million, which includes expenditure on local road construction of \$1.63 million, resealing works totaling \$970,000, road gravel resheeting worth \$560,000, urban drainage to the value of \$430,000, bridges and culverts worth \$420,000, township street improvements of \$320,000 and road shoulder resheeting totalling \$250,000.

In 2014-15, Council budgeted \$4 million for its Capital Works Program. With only seven weeks left in the financial year, Council has completed 90% of the works.

As part of this program, 25km of gravel roads and more than 20km of gravel shoulders have been resheeted costing \$950,000.

We have also seen a number of major rehabilitation works completed on Council's sealed road network at the cost of \$1.32 million.

The projects that have been completed in this financial year include the Borung Hurstwood Road, Rheola Llanelly Road, Pyramid Yarraberb Road and the Bridgewater Raywood Road.

Council has also completed urban drainage projects worth \$250,000, its resealing program of \$580,000 and bridges and culvert works totalling \$200,000.

Loddon Shire Council is committed to providing a well maintained road network for its residents

This first stage will be built on the Kiniry street side of the existing building, so will not interfere in the use of the existing building. All BDH services will continue with no interruption. While there will be plenty of activity going on, access will remain at the front entrance uninterrupted. The front car park will remain open for all visitors and patients.

**However access directly to the nursing home through the garden will be blocked.** Residents will also not be able to go into the garden after commencement of works.

There may be some restriction to the use of the end of Kiniry St at certain times but the contractors will clearly mark the road as closed and control all traffic on these rare occasions.

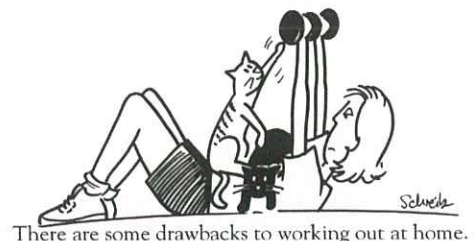
