COVID-19 and garage sales

Loddon Shire residents are reminded that outdoor garage sales are not permitted under the Third Step of the Roadmap to reopening as they are on private residential property.

The public gathering limit only applies to public spaces, and therefore is not applicable to household gardens or privately owned outdoor spaces. You can only have up to two people visit you at home each day.

The two people may be from different households and may visit separately. Your intimate partner and dependents are not included in the cap.

Mayor elected

This is the third time Cr Beattie has been elected Mayor. Cr Beattie was previously Mayor in 2015 and 2016.

Councillors were also officially sworn in at the Special Council Meeting, taking the Affirmation of Office and making a written declaration that they will abide by the Councillor Code of Conduct.

Fire danger period for Loddon Shire

The 2020/21 Fire Danger Period (FDP) for Loddon Shire is now in effect.

The FDP, which is declared by the Country Fire Authority (CFA), started at 1am this morning (Monday 23 November). The FDP will run through the warmer months, ending on 1 May 2021.

During the FDP fires cannot be lit in the open air without a written permit from the CFA or a Municipal Fire Prevention Officer.

Customer service office reopens

Council's Wedderburn customer service office has reopened, with COVIDSafe measures in place.

All visitors to Council's customer service office must follow these COVIDSafe measures, which includes sanitising your hands on entry and following social distancing markers. Face masks must be worn unless you have a valid reason to not wear one.

Until otherwise advised, cash payments will not be accepted by Council's customer service staff. If you wish to make a payment by cash, please go to your local Australia Post Office. Meetings with non-reception Council staff will be by appointment only. To arrange an appointment, please call Reception on 5494 1200.

As many Council staff are still working from home (as per the direction from the Victorian Chief Health Officer) most appointments will be conducted via video conferencing. Please let Reception staff know if you need help with video conferencing when making your appointment.

In some cases, a meeting room and Council computer may be used for video conferencing. For people familiar with video conferencing, you can use your smart phone, tablet or home computer.

Swimming pools now open

Council's five public swimming pools are now open for the 2020/21 season.

Swimming pools are located at Boort, Inglewood, Mitiamo, Pyramid Hill and Wedderburn.

To make our pools safe and to operate within current COVID-19 guidelines, restrictions are in place at all pools.

This includes using the QR code access system or providing staff with contact details upon entry to pools, wearing of masks when outside of the pool and maintaining social distancing.

Hand sanitiser will be available at the entrance/kiosk for use by attendees when entering pools and any time as needed.

During busy periods, attendees will be asked to stay no longer than two hours at the swimming pool. There will also be a maximum number of people allowed in a pool at any one time.



Mammatus clouds are some of the most unusual and distinctive clouds formations with a series of bulges or pouches emerging from the base of a cloud. The shape of mammatus formations can vary widely; from the classic protruding shape, to a more elongated tube hanging from the cloud above.

Mammatus clouds are usually formed in association with large cumulonimbus clouds. Typically, turbulence within the cumulonimbus cloud will cause mammatus to form, especially on the underside of the projecting anvil as it rapidly descends to lower levels. This reverses the usual cloud-forming process of upward growth, making for an uneven cloud base.

Mammatus often forms in association with Cumulonimbus clouds, which in turn bring thunderstorms due to their huge mass of unstable air. Mammatus cloud generally form in the most unstable cumulonimbus, meaning that there is also a chance of hail, heavy rain and lightning in the vicinity, and if the air is cold enough during winter they can produce snow. Sometimes mammatus may form on other cloud types which produce no rain, though this is far less common.

Mammatus comes from the Latin mamma which translates to "udder" or "breast". Their striking appearance is most visible when the sun is low in the sky and their pouches are framed by the sunlight. This supplementary feature is a firm favourite with many meteorologists as well as cloud and photography enthusiasts.



HARVEST TIME IN BOORT March 12th 1898 Weekly Times National Library of Australia



Barraport wheat stacks, C.S. Balding the Buyer, Mick Thomas has bag on back and Harry Stewart on the stack.

Harvest season in 1898 was a much better year than the 1897 season, it was a busy year for the local farmers with a continuous flow of bullock and horse teams to the station yards. Boort sent 8100 bags of wheat in December from the station with several hundred more waiting to be loaded onto railway trucks. By the end of the season the total amount given for the 2 months was 20,720 bags of wheat sent from Boort station. In surrounding districts the numbers were Barraport: 8111 bags, Gredgwin: 1382 bags, Oakvale: 4107 bags and Mysia: 9500 bags.



O'Brien said.

Recent data released by AusPlay has shown that children's physical activity levels were heavily impacted by COVID-19. The data highlighted that less than one in five Australian children were active in organised activities outside of school during COVID-19 lockdown.

"Even before the pandemic, there were concerns that children were not moving enough, and with students learning from home for much of 2020, with no access to a playground at lunchtime or organised sport after school or on the weekends, the research has shown that levels of inactivity have increased during this time.




