Children's Week Activity at Boort District School

The Victorian Department of Education and Training invited eligible organisations to apply for a grant to contribute to the cost of hosting a Children's Week activity that celebrated the theme *Children have the right to choose their own friends and safely connect with others.* Children's Week 2021 was held within the 23th—31st October 2021.

Over three days the children created a collaborative canvas approx. 3 meters by 1.5 meters. It was digitally recorded as they produced the canvas. The children discussed with Sophia (BRIC Manager) concepts around friendship and resilience before they began to contribute to the canvas. Through creating the artwork together the students learnt to make choices and recognise their emotions while creating art together.

The activity also included listening to a digital reading of the story The Most Magnificent Thing by Ashley Spires.

Community Vision and Council Plan adopted

At its meeting last week, Council adopted the Loddon Shire Community Vision 2031 and Council Plan 2021-2025.

The Community Vision 2031 and Council Plan 2021-2025 reflect Council's commitment to listen to our community's vision for the future and deliver a progressive and future-focused plan that will see the Shire continue to grow and prosper.

These critical documents were developed with feedback and collaboration from the community, including through The Loddon Project, which undertook extensive community engagement across the Shire.

The Community Vision 2031 is:

Creating a community where everyone is welcome and has the opportunity to live, work and thrive.

This Community Vision is supported by the Council Plan's key themes, each with their own strategic objectives. These themes are:

- A sustainable built and natural environment
- A growing and vibrant community
- A diverse and expanding economy
- A supported and accessible community

On behalf of Council, I'd like to thank all the community members who contributed to The Loddon Project and who provided feedback to the draft Council Vision and Council Plan. This involvement was crucial in developing a blueprint for Loddon Shire's future.

This Community Vision and Council Plan puts us in good stead to advocate for additional Federal and State Government investment in our community to build on our goals — including population growth, infrastructure, sustainability, the environment and youth.

Council also adopted the Financial Plan 2020-21 to 2030-31, which guides Council in long-term decision-making and supports achievement towards the Community Vision 2031 and Council Plan 2021-2025. Neighbourhood Safer Places Plan adopted

At its meeting last week, Council adopted the most recent Loddon Shire Council Neighbourhood Safer Places Plan (NSP) – September 2021.

The plan includes and confirms designated NSPs within our municipality in the townships of Boort, Bridgewater, Inglewood, Pyramid Hill, Serpentine and Wedderburn.

Neighbourhood Safer Places are located at: Boort Park Recreation Reserve (oval only)

Bridgewater Memorial Hall (grounds only)

Inglewood – J Sloan Park Playground (between the swimming pool and tennis courts)

Pyramid Hill – Mitchell Park Recreation Reserve (oval only)

Serpentine Recreation Reserve (Janiember Park) (oval only)

Wedderburn – Donaldson Park (oval area only)

NSPs are places of last resort when all other bushfire plans have failed. They are not community fire refuges or emergency relief centres. They do not replace any planning you have in place to respond to a fire nor a response to emergency alerts – including evacuation warnings.

Lockdown pests, weeds and diseases this harvest

Agriculture Victoria is encouraging farmers to be aware of farm biosecurity measures at harvest time.

According to Agriculture Victoria, the movement of grain harvest contractors between farming regions can spread diseases, pests and weeds through soil and plant matter found on clothing, vehicles, machinery and grain handling equipment.

The department is encouraging farmers to be aware of biosecurity risks that moving from farm to farm can pose and mitigate these risks, including asking some questions.

These include asking where the contractor last worked, if any properties had any hard-to-kill or pesticide resistant weeds, insects and diseases, what crops were harvested, and when, how and where did they clean their vehicles and equipment down.

Further easing of restrictions

Last week the Victorian Government announced the lifting of almost all remaining restrictions statewide for fully vaccinated people. There are now no limits in the home and no caps or density limits for cafes and restaurants. We are pleased to be able to welcome tourists and visitors to our businesses and natural attractions in the Loddon Valley.

Masks are required for workers and customers at indoor retail, for visitors and select workers in hospitals or care facilities, for people using public transport, taxi/rideshare and planes, and for workers serving the public at hospitality venues.

Masks are also required for primary school staff and visitors and for students in Years 3 to 6.

The Victorian Government also announced changes around isolation requirements. The vast majority of people who come into contact with a confirmed positive case outside their home will no longer have to self-quarantine. These contacts will be required to get a standard (PCR) test and isolate until they get a negative result.

This means exposure in places like offices, restaurants or nightclubs won't automatically result in quarantine for the patrons or staff, who previously would have been designated Primary Close Contacts at Tier 1

exposure sites.

The Department of Health will continue to manage emerging outbreaks of concern and 'superspreader events' and can impose a quarantine period on contacts on a case-by-case basis, depending on evidence.

Exposure sites will no longer be published. Instead, the Department will use the new alert function in the Service Victoria app to notify patrons of higher-risk venues where positive cases have been present – such as restaurants, gyms and nightclubs – and advise them to get tested.

Fire Danger Period for Loddon now in effect

The Fire Danger Period for Loddon Shire began at 1am on 22 November.

This means that fires cannot be lit in the open air without a written permit from the CFA or Municipal Fire Prevention Officer.

Fire Danger Periods are based on local conditions and take into account fuel moisture, fuel loads, grassland curing, weather and rainfall.

Lighting a fire in the open without a permit is an offence and can bring a penalty of over \$19,000 and/ or 12 months imprisonment.

Barbeques and fires for cooking and warmth do not require a permit, but must be lit in properly constructed fireplaces.

The use of an incinerator, chainsaw/lawn mower, welding/grinding equipment and vehicles that come in contact with vegetation and machinery with an internal combustion/heat engine are permitted provided conditions are followed.



The November meeting gave way to a get to know people and information evening.

Our guest speaker was Mr Ben Scullin, Chief Executive Officer of Victorian Recreational Fishers (V R Fish). Other guests included Mr Ivan Wild and Mr Alan Nicolson, who represent our Mid Northern Association of Angling Clubs at V R Fish. Ben gave a comprehensive talk on what this organisation is all about, what they do for recreational fishers, the community, and the environment. He explained how Angling Clubs and other fisher persons need to communicate their needs, wants and ideas so that V R Fish can better represent them. About one in five Victorians like to fish and most of them are keen to enjoy and look after the environment

where-ever they go. Recreational fishing is a major contributor to tourism, resulting in many millions of dollars being gained by rural and regional Victoria. Recreational Fishing Licences raised over nine million dollars for Victorian Government in 2020 — 2021, and only about five percent is passed on to V R Fish for operational funds to help promote fishing. Better Boating Victoria (via boat licences etc) contributes a further thirty-three million dollars, much of which is from fishing boats. Ben's presentation was followed by a question time with open discussion which was beneficial all. We believe that this sport, and indeed the industry, is under rated and underfunded when you consider its contribution to the Victorian economy.

We as recreational fishers and fishing clubs need to speak with one voice. V R Fish provides this voice to convey these facts and any constructive ideas to all tiers of government and other authorities so that recreational fishing gets the consideration it deserves.

There will be no December meeting, so next meeting will be 7.30pm Wednesday 12th January 2021. We may be able to arrange one or two social events before then, so watch the town notice boards for these.

Fire Prevention – Loddon Shire Council

From Monday 8 November 2021, the Loddon Shire Council Municipal Fire Prevention Officer (MFPO) will be starting inspections across Loddon Shire.

The MFPO inspects properties throughout the Loddon Shire, to identify whether landowners are maintaining appropriate levels of vegetation and reducing fuel loads, particularly in high-risk areas. Landowners who have excess vegetation, that is, large amounts of branches piled up or long grass or debris, will be issued a fire prevention notice.

A fire prevention notice is a reminder for the property owner to reduce the fire risk at their place. Landowners typically have 14 days to comply with the notice or make contact with Council to discuss the issue. If the hazard is not removed within the required timeframe, Council will organise for a contractor to enter the premises and remove the fire hazard.

If Council has to arrange a contractor to remove fire hazards, it will be completed at the landowner's cost, plus a \$110 administrative cost. Under Section 41E of the Country Fire Authority Act 1958, a \$1,817 infringement notice may also be issued to the landowner for a failure to comply with a fire prevention notice.



Gannawarra Goes Orange Against Family Violence

Each year between 25 November and 10 December, Northern District Community Health (NDCH) partner with local government and health and community services agencies for the Gannawarra Goes Orange campaign. The campaign coincides with the Victoria wide 16 days of Activism against Family Violence and Gender-Based Violence.

The family violence rates across Gannawarra are more than twice the state average. In the vast majority of cases, women were the victims of family violence with a concerning number of those incidents occurring with a child, or children, recorded as a witness.

This year, the local services partnership has developed a 16 Days of Activism calendar with lots of activities occurring across the 16 days. Each activity has a focus on either raising awareness, providing education or breaking down rigid gender roles and stereotypes. Rigid gender roles and stereotypes are one of the four main drivers of violence against women.

"One of the ways to prevent violence against women is to promote gender equality," said Ms Hutchinson. "This means changing ideas that things are only a woman's role, that women and girls are somehow weak, that they're less deserving or of less worth than a male. We need to grow our children up to be respectful of each other and to feel able to be vulnerable and seek help when they need it, rather than coping alone and consequently becoming abusive."

Healing Garden

You may have noticed the front garden of Boort District Health (BDH) is looking different at the moment.

We have started working on providing a quiet / reflective area for patients and residents to sit and enjoy outside. Previously this area was grass, garden and had no fencing around it. A fence has been erected around the boundary to ensure the safety of all at the facility.

This area previously posed a risk for any patients or residents to use.



Currently the area looks unsightly as we move forward with our plan, the paths have been laid with aggregate concrete, this will enable residents and patients to move safely around the area when finished.

The next phase will include:

- Garden edges around the path to ensure patient
 - and resident safety
- Soil added to the garden area to enable planting



Maintenance will install the garden edges, & planting will be completed with the assistance of the Consumer Advisory Committee. The indigenous plants to be supplied by Paul Haw.

Maintenance will build a Gazebo (purchased from

George Tallis Home Hardware) to cover the large concrete area to ensure shade for all that use the garden.

We are working with the school and looking forward to the school children producing artwork for this area.

To finish the garden:

- . Rocks will be added to the garden area
- Seating installed for resident and patients
- Water feature in the centre of the path BDH will keep you updated with photos and our progress.






