It is seeking feedback on issues and opportunities with the bushfire planning provisions including developing:

a more usable state bushfire planning policy clearer planning requirements for developing land in bushfire prone areas better bushfire hazard assessments improving the implementation of bushfire-related planning permit conditions training and capacity building opportunities.

The Victorian Government remains committed to the planning policy objective of prioritising life in decision making.

We celebrate our nation's place in the world – a proud, ancient, multicultural nation built on shared values that allow us to enjoy the freedoms and opportunities that other nations aspire to.

The day saw community celebrations held across our Shire to recognise what it means to be Australian, to acknowledge our rich history and celebrate the selfless contributions of our volunteers.

These celebrations are also a chance to reflect on the resilience of our communities and their spirit of helping and giving that defines the Australian way.

COVID-19 Update - Please wear masks!

Local health services and local government are meeting regularly to discuss the impact of Omicron, with expectations that local case numbers will continue to rise.

<u>Testing- please help keep our community and health work-force safe- wear a mask.</u>

As of today, a positive Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) will no longer require confirmation via a PCR test.

Therefore community members are encouraged to utilise Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT) to ascertain whether they have COVID or not. However, we do recognise that RAT tests are not readily available at present.

For those people who are unable to access RAT tests, they can consider utilising the below PCR service. PCR Testing is free and is available Monday – Friday at the NDCH Clinic in Kerang.

To be eligible for a PCR test at the NDCH Clinic in Kerang, community members will need to be:

Symptomatic

Directed by Health Officials i.e. asymptomatic household contact unable to access RAT

In addition, people who are required to use Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT) (e.g. asymptomatic household contacts) but who cannot access a Rapid Antigen Test, can get a PCR.

"Please be patient, we have been inundated with calls, and our team are doing their best to manage. We are reaching capacity each day, and our Reception and Nursing team are working extremely hard." NDCH CEO Mandy Hutchinson said.

"We ask that all businesses continue to be vigilant with supporting their customers to wear masks, sanitise their hands and QR code in. The last thing we need is our healthcare staff being exposed to COVID when they are out shopping locally. We need our health workforce to remain healthy so they can care for patients and continue to do their roles in managing COVID. Masks worn correctly and Vaccinations, including Boosters, are our best protection."

Your wellbeing

We ask that you continue to be kind to each other and to our front line workers, nurses, doctors, police, supermarket staff and receptionists, to name a few, who are all working hard to support our community.

Boort District Health Director of Clinical Services, Donna Doyle says: "We need to expect that COVID-19 will impact our communities, our neighbours, work colleagues and possibly our loved ones. When it does, we are encouraging everyone in our community to take a 'no blame' approach. The Omicron strain spreads easily which is why measures like wearing masks, social distancing, avoiding poorly ventilated or crowded spaces and hand hygiene continue to be in place to slow it down, however blaming others only adds to the pressures being felt by our community. We ask that you show each other empathy, support and care. Be kind to yourself and others, stay safe and be informed by reliable sources."

We hope that the harvest went well, everyone had a good family Christmas, the new year is kind, and that those lucky enough, had a good break.

Little Lake Boort is looking fantastic with lots of boats and lots of kids and others out there having the time of their lives.

The BAC five stage 2021 building improvement plan is going well and by the time this goes to print the exterior of the building should be painted. The other two stages should be complete within a few weeks. Another project, to improve the outside lighting, including for the public toilets will be done soon. We had an onsight meeting with a Loddon Shire representative and Councillor Beattie, regarding the lack of footpaths for the public toilets and BAC clubrooms and we are confident that they will be considered in the Loddon Shire estimates for the 2022 - 2023 financial year.

Fishing reports indicate that the old redfin is having a

real comeback in the reservoirs and many lakes. Natives like Murray Cod and Yellow Belly are more plentiful than most can remember in most waters. "Tongue in cheek" Does this mean that restocking is working that well, and the natives are getting on top of carp? Hopefully less carp will lead to better water quality, increased food for other fish and better growth rates in natives and redfin??? Perhaps the harvesting of hundreds / thousands of carp for processing is helping???

Quite a few people came along ready to assist and lots of onlookers. Five of the local lads stripped off and did really, well herding the fish towards the nets. A fair bet, they were extremely tired next day.





golden perch (yellow belly), up to around the 2kilogram mark, red fin and even the odd cod, these were all immediately released back into the lake. If you are looking to wet a line, there is fish in there.

A big thanks to Keith from K&C FISHERIES and his off -sider Terry for their efforts. Their direct and professional approach gives indication of why they are successful. Even though we did not get many carp, the knowledge sharing and seeing the set up was a revelation. In Keith's words "don't worry about the poor catch, it was a good public relations exercise, and everyone enjoyed themselves, look at those kids chasing fish. We will get more next time."

Once the community plan is developed, Community Planning Groups present their plans to Council Community Plans Council determine what projects and activities to prioritise and what involvement Council will have as communities work to deliver the actions identified in their community plans.

Getting involved

Community planning is open to everyone in the community, the commitment and input required is flexible. Residents can volunteer to be a member of the local Community Planning group, contribute to implementing one specific project you are particularly passionate about or just like to input your ideas and comments into the Community Plan.

There are many benefits to being involved in community planning. These include;

- Helping improve your community such as establishing more social events, develop new infrastructure, facilitates or help to 'beautifying' the town
- Meet new people
- Gain satisfaction and a sense of achievement from contributing to the community
- Learn new skills

- Wear loose breathable clothing

Heat Stroke Signs may include: Unusual behaviour or awareness Feeling hot to touch Dry or flush skin Heavy sweating Feeling sick or vomiting Feeling faint or fainting Fast breathing

What to do:

Call 000 Get out of the heat Lay down Remove excess layers of clothing Place damp cloths or towels over the body Take sips of cold water


