Southern Riverlands Poultry began its venture into free range chicken farming in 2019 about 7 kilometres north of Boort. Since that time construction of more sheds has continued on the farm with an expected population of 700,000 birds by March 2021. All of our birds are grown for Hazeldenes and sold as a free-range certified premium product labelled as The Bare Bird. This product can be purchased at the butcher in Boort as well as other select local suppliers.

All the birds that are grown at Southern Riverlands Poultry are coordinated off-site by Hazeldenes, a proud Bendigo born and bred company who supply premium chicken nationally and overseas.



Our farm in Boort receives the birds as day old hatchlings and they are grown for anywhere between five to seven weeks at which point Hazeldenes collects the birds to be processed in Lockwood.

Free-ranging begins when the birds are approximately three weeks old and birds continue ranging daily for the life of the birds. The free range areas are well maintained with mown grass, native trees and plentiful shade coverings.

The birds are fed a premium feed mixture that is vegetarian, anti-biotic free and hormone free.



employees including two from Boort in additional to contractors and local tradesman. The owner of our farm - Jarrod Trevanion - has relocated to Boort with his wife and two children to oversee the construction and operation of Southern Riverlands Poultry. Chicken farming is a novel experience and an exciting endeavour for our employees. With six batches of chickens per year the farm at its current capacity will grow over 4 million birds per year giving us all a great opportunity to constantly develop innovative and effective farming practices. Australians currently are eating more chicken than ever before with an average of nearly 50kg consumed per capita per annum which is greater than beef, lamb and pork combined.

Employment positions for our farm are all advertised locally with locals given preference. With construction of our farm carrying on for a number of years it has also been a reliable source for local youth employment. The construction and farm operations has also included many local contractors over the years and will continue to in the future with ongoing earthworks, plumbing, engineering and mechanical work.

The Southern Riverlands Poultry owners appreciate all the support that the local community has given them and has further plans for more development in Boort and surrounding areas throughout the coming years. We have been welcomed into the community and we remain committed in creating strong relationships with businesses and local sporting clubs by offering our support. We look forward to further supporting the local community to ensure a long and enduring success for both the Farm and the community alike.

MAYORAL COLUMN 11 January 2021

Happy New Year

Welcome to the first Mayoral Column for 2021. I hope all of our residents had a great Christmas and a happy New Year.

It was certainly a mixed holiday period - with the return of new restrictions on New Year's Eve and the closure of the Victorian border to New South Wales from 11.59pm on New Year's Day. At the time of writing, it was reported that the border closure would likely remain in place until the end of the month.

Although some local government areas are contained within a "border bubble" - including Loddon Shire, it has been disappointing to see this sudden border closure. Similar to when New South Wales closed its border to Victoria, this closure has a huge effect on rural border towns, including on local tourism, hospitality and other businesses.

Our communities and businesses need certainty and while I understand concern regarding the emergence of COVID-19 cases, it seems once again our rural communities in border towns are bearing a huge burden when there are currently no cases in these rural areas.

Projects update

Council continues to be busy with a number of projects either underway or scheduled for the New Year.

This includes the reconstruction and widening of two kilometres of Bridgewater Raywood Road (seven kilometres out of Bridgewater). Works have started on this project and are expected to be completed at the end of March.

The majority of upgrade works at the Wedderburn Pioneer Caravan Park are almost complete, while works at the Pyramid Hill Caravan Park have commenced. Works at the Boort Lakes Holiday Park will start after the holiday period.

The upgrades to these caravan parks include road and drainage works, powerhead upgrades, solar lighting and new amenities blocks (construction of these amenities blocks for all three caravan parks has started off site).

The reconstruction and widening of 3.7 kilometres of the Echuca Serpentine Road, three kilometres west of Bendigo Pyramid Road has completed.

Safety upgrade works on the Old Inglewood Reservoir are now complete, as is the Victoria Street drainage upgrade project in front of the Pyramid Hill Swimming Pool.

A number of townships signs have been replaced around the Shire. In total 54 township signs have been replaced.

Starting this month will be the Heales Street drainage project at Inglewood. Works will also start this month on new footpaths, kerb and channel, and some underground drainage at High Street in Wedderburn (from near the 24 Karat Café to the police station corner) will start this month.

Additionally, works will start this month on culvert replacement on the Seven Months Creek in Kelly Street, Pyramid Hill (near the secondary college). At this stage, it is anticipated there will be a detour around the works site, with traffic management in place, including traffic lights.

Works to upgrade the barrier rail on the Yorkshire Road bridge over Spring Creek will also get underway this month.

A number of projects are currently out to tender including the Bailey's Road Bridge replacement over Bullock Creek in Derby and Godfrey Street boardwalk in Wedderburn (connecting the footpaths on either side of Nardoo Creek).

Tenders are also out for new Female Friendly Changerooms to be built at the Bridgewater Recreation Reserve and culvert replacement on Prairie West Road (east of Jarklin).

The tender for the installation of kerb and channel and associated works at Lake View and Andrews Street in Boort closed last week, while Council's reseal tender closed just before Christmas.

The tender to install footpaths in locations across the Shire has been awarded. These locations are Barber Street in Pyramid Hill, Sullivan Street, Southie Street, Houston Street and Belmont Street in Inglewood, Armstrong Street and McMillans Road in Boort, Nelson Street in Newbridge, and the lane behind High Street in Wedderburn (near the lawn bowls club).

MASH launch

The MASH (More Australian

Solar Homes) solar bulk-buy

program was launched in Wedderburn in December. The program is part of Council's ongoing partnership with the Central Victorian Greenhouse Alliance.

MASH makes it easier and more affordable for Loddon Shire households and businesses to install a



solar power system in order to cut their electricity bills and CO² emissions.

Uptake of solar in Loddon Shire is currently at 31 per cent (this sits above the national average of 27 per cent). The MASH program aims to further increase this to 33 per cent.

This will raise \$5,000 to be donated to a not-forprofit organisation here in Loddon to cover the cost of a 4.29kW solar power system. MASH supports local communities by donating one percent of project revenues to community groups and schools in the form of free solar. So far, MASH has donated and installed 17 solar power systems across Central Victoria through the bulk-buy program.



Regional Travel Voucher Scheme – Round 2

Registrations for Round 2 of the Victorian Government's Regional Travel Voucher Scheme open this Wednesday 20 January.

Vouchers will be offered to Victorian residents to contribute to the costs of accommodation, tourism attractions or tours undertaken in regional Victoria, the Yarra Ranges and the Mornington Peninsula.

Victorians who receive a voucher and spend at least \$400 on accommodation, attractions or tours during their stay will be eligible to receive a reimbursement of \$200 on presentation of receipts.

The program works on a 'first-come-first-served' basis and each round will close once all places have been filled for that particular round.

Important changes to your Victorian Seniors Card off-peak travel vouchers

From 2020, free travel vouchers will no longer be automatically sent to Victorian Seniors Card holders.

From January 1, both existing and new Victorian Seniors Card holders will need to opt-in to receive free travel vouchers in future by registering at the au/vouchers. You will only need to register once. If you are a new card holder please note that to receive your free off-peak travel vouchers you now need to opt in by registering at www.ptv.vic.gov.au/vouchers and you'll receive vouchers in the mail each year.

You can redeem your free travel vouchers for:

- a day's unlimited travel in zones 1 and 2, this is a 1 Day Travel
 Pass, just go to a metropolitan premium station or PTV Hub
- two off-peak V/Line singles or day return, just go to a staffed V/Line station or ticket agent.



2011 Floods – 10 Years on

This week marks the 10 year anniversary of the January 2011 flood event; the second largest in recorded history and significantly bigger than the September and December events in 2010. Written records indicate that its magnitude was exceeded only by the floods of 1909.

The fast flowing flood travelled north from the upper reaches of the Loddon River, the Bullock



Creek and Bendigo Creek, from outside the Shire. Newbridge was the first town affected, followed by Bridgewater. The flood waters then moved further north along the Loddon River dispersing into creeks and anabranches as it traversed the northern floodplains to eventually enter the Murray River system.

At the flood's peak, water volumes recorded at the Laanecoorie Reservoir spillway reached

194 gigalitres per day. To put this volume into context, Melbourne uses 460 gigalitres of water per year.

Over 30% (approx 2,200 sq km) of the Shire was impacted. At its peak, the flood was reported to be 90 km long and 50 km wide.

Many farms and towns were directly impacted. The flood progressively caused dislocation and isolation of many parts of the Shire with the flood waters cutting roads (including the Calder Highway and the Loddon Valley Highway for several days). Subsequent damage assessments confirmed approximately \$30 million damage was caused to Council managed infrastructure alone.

We join those members of our community who will take some this week to reflect on the event, which delivered many challenges but also demonstrated the strength and resilience of our people and communities as they dealt with and then recovered from the impacts of the flood.

We know that many members of our community were impacted by the 2011 Floods. If reflecting on the event at this time causes you to experience an emotional or physical reaction, we encourage you to contact your doctor, mental health professional or Lifeline on 13 11 14.


Every year thousands of people in Victoria suffer a cardiac arrest, tragically, only one in ten people currently survive. A cardiac arrest occurs when the heart suddenly stops. Immediate action is critical to save a life.

When a bystander performs Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) a person is twice as likely to survive. If an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is also used, this survival rate dramatically increases. That's why it is vital that bystanders act quickly in the first critical minutes of a cardiac arrest.

Community education sessions will be conducted throughout February by Boort's very own Ambulance Officers to teach the important steps of saving a life.





Boort Historical Society Inc. A Piece of History

Boort Railway Terminus Hotel was built in 1887 the proprietor being T. B. Durham. The Railway Terminus Hotel was destroyed by fire on 23rd June 1914 and was rebuilt in a few months. The new Hotel had 20 bedrooms, 2 sitting rooms, 2 dining rooms, 2 parlours, 2 bathrooms, a kitchen, servery and scullery, sample room, lounge and large hall, billiard room and balcony. The cost of the building was in

the vicinity of £4,500. The licensee not seeing it finished as he died suddenly a week before it was finished, his widow selling the property to Mr J. W. Clement's of Boort in 1915, who applied to the Licensing Courts to have the hotel name changed from the Railway Terminus Hotel to Railway Hotel. 1977 found big renovations with John and Judith Selleck opening the bistro which included dismantling of the staircase which was built in 1914, with the job being done by "Dickie the Brickie" Charlton. Michelle McGrath opened Totti's restaurant in 1981 in the Victorian Dining Room of the Railway Hotel, opening on Friday and Saturday nights and special functions. Michelle would do prep work but cooking was left to Graham Pattison. 1991 was when a new door was formed at the front of the Hotel by Russell and Robyn Hayes, for an entry to the new TAB facility, part of the bar was transformed for access to computers for customers placing bets with the new system. Video Jungle was opened in a room at the Hotel in 1993, having over 400 titles and Kane Leeds was on hand to help you make a choice.
