The draft Community Vision and Council Plan, proposed Financial Plan 2020/21 to 2030/31 and Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan are advertised for community feedback.

The Community Vision and Council Plan have been drafted in accordance with sections 88 and 90 of the Local Government Act 2020 and in consultation with its Community Reference Group and the community.

The proposed 10-year Financial Plan has been prepared after consideration at the Council Forum held on Tuesday 14 September.

The draft Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan has four key themes:

- Good physical health

Pool and spa registrations reminder

With summer fast approaching, pool and spa owners are reminded they must register their pool with Council.

On 1 December 2019, new laws to improve swimming pool and spa safety came into effect in Victoria. They introduced new registration, inspection and certification requirements for property owners.

As part of the changes, owners are required to register their pool and spa with Council. Owners are also required to have their pool safety barrier / fence inspected every four years or if they are selling a property or leasing a property that has a pool or spa capable of holding more than 300mm of water.

The requirements to provide a safety barrier / fence applies to all pools and spas with the exception of a relocatable pool that are only capable of holding a depth of water less than 300mm.

Loddon returns to border bubble

Last Friday, the Victorian Chief Health Officer announced that a number of local government areas would return to the "border bubble" for cross-border communities between Victoria and New South Wales – including Loddon Shire.

This means that if you live in a local government area in the Victoria-NSW cross-border area, you can cross the border and return home to Victoria without a permit, provided that:

You have not been in an extreme risk zone or red zone outside of the cross-border area after the relevant zone commencement time in the last 14 days.

You have not been to an exposure site.

If you have been in an orange zone outside of the cross-border area after the relevant zone commencement time in the last 14 days, you have been tested for COVID-19 and received a negative result since leaving the orange zone.

You don't have COVID-19 or have any symptoms, and you are not a close contact of a confirmed COVID-19 case.

Community Sport Sector COVID-19 Survival Package applications

Applications are now open for the fourth round of the Community Sport Sector COVID-19 Survival Package.

Funding can be used for ongoing fixed costs, essential salary costs and any other costs that keep organisations viable and to purchase equipment and cleaning supplies necessary to function in a COVIDSafe manner once restrictions ease.

Clubs who have not previously received funding from this program can apply for \$1,500 and associations and leagues can apply for \$2,500.

Clubs who have received funding in previous rounds will be considered for an automatic top-up payment and do not need to submit a new application. Sport and Recreation Victoria will email organisations that are eligible for a top-up payment by the end of October 2021.

Coronavirus Update

Restrictions set to ease further

With Victoria set to hit its 80 per cent double-dose

vaccination milestone this Friday 29 October – almost a week ahead of schedule, the Victorian Government has announced the further easing of restrictions.

From 6pm this Friday, regional Victoria and metropolitan Melbourne will come together under the same restrictions, meaning that travel between Melbourne and regional Victoria will open up.

Most indoor settings, such as restaurants, pubs, gyms and hairdressers will open with no caps (subject to density limits) if all staff and patrons are fully vaccinated.

Most outdoor settings will remain at one person per two square metres, with a limit up to 500, where staff and patrons are fully vaccinated.

These indoor and outdoor settings will also apply to weddings, funerals and religious gatherings if all attendees are fully vaccinated. Caps of 30 people will apply for weddings, funerals and religious gatherings if vaccination status is unknown.

Masks will remain mandatory indoors but will no longer be required outdoors. However, it's highly recommended you continue to wear a mask outdoors where you cannot physically distance.

The Victorian Government has further detailed what our state will look like once we hit a 90 per cent double-dose vaccination rate – which is predicted to be 24 November.

This will include a significant easing of all major restrictions, including removal of caps or density quotients for all settings, and masks will only be mandatory indoors in some high-risk settings, such as hospitals, aged care, public transport and justice and correctional facilities.


From Friday 29 October, we'll be able to open our doors to more people, given they are fully vaccinated.

We are now well into the time of year where snakes are becoming more prevalent as the weather heats up. We have already had several snake bites across the region in the last 2 months! <u>All snake bites can be potentially life threatening and needs</u> to be treated as a medical emergency

Venom from the wound or clothing can be used to detect if venom has been inflicted the wound and for that reason do not wash or suck the wound or discard any clothing.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

- Severe pain around the bite
- Swelling, bruising or bleeding
- Bite marks (may be obvious puncture wounds or almost invisible small scratches)
- Nausea and/or vomiting
- Dizziness
- Blurred vision
- Headache
- Difficulty breathing
- Stomach pain
- Difficulty swallowing
- Tingling, stinging, burning or abnormal feelings of the skin

IN ALL CASES OF SNAKE BITES CALL 000

WHAT TO DO

- 1 Follow DRSABCD.
- 2 Call triple zero (000) for an ambulance.
- 3 Lie the patient down and ask them to keep still. Reassure the patient.
- 4 If on a limb, apply an elasticised roller bandage (10–15 cm wide) over the bite site as soon as possible.

Apply a further elasticised roller bandage (10–15 cm wide), starting just above the fingers or toes and moving upwards on the bitten limb as far as can be reached.

Use clothing or other material if an elasticised roller bandage is not available.

Apply the bandage as tightly as possible to the limb.

- 5 Immobilise the bandaged limb using splints.
- Keep the patient lying down and completely still (immobilised).
- 7 Write down the time of the bite and when the bandage was applied. If possible, mark the location of the bite site (if known) on the skin with a pen, or photograph the site.
- 8 Stay with the patient until medical aid arrives.





The Ceremony will start at 10:45am. The public is welcome to attend. This is the day to remember all the fallen from the Boort Region and the sacrifice they paid. This year Boort RSL will be selling Tokens and Poppies in front of the local IGA store subject to COVID restrictions and most likely be for sale in the Boort News-agency and the Post Office. laxed game of social bowls. The Club is still waiting on instructions from Bowls Victoria as to when they can start playing pennant and holding tournaments as these above events help the Club both socially and financially.

The Little Lake Boort Asset Committee has just held its Annual General Meeting, Neil Beattie is once again president, Ray Stomann (our local Policeman) is the Treasurer and Barry Kennedy continues on as Secretary. This is one of the most important committees in Boort, as Little Lake Boort is the main asset to the town, possibly the Shire for tourism. It is estimated that the lake could be worth up to \$3 million to the community every year. During the Summer holidays and the Easter period the population of the town doubles. The Committee is looking for new members, especially young ones to make sure that the assets are well managed in the future. A Brief History of the Lake Little Lake Boort was once part of the Big Lake until it was annexed off by an irrigation channel in the 1920's. Both wetlands were covered with Red Gums and fringed by Black Box. All of the Red Gums drowned during the 1850's after Mr Godfrey (owner of Boort Station) changed the course of the Loddon River filling the wetlands permanently. By 1900, practically every tree was cleared out of Little Lake Boort so it could be used for the Rowing Club, fishing and swimming. The original township of Boort used to be on the banks of the Kinypanial Creek which flowed into the Big Lake, after the 1870 flood (the biggest flood that has ever been recorded) shifted to higher ground on the Lunette Hill where Boort stands today. Also, the Railway line which came through in 1883 guaranteed that the town had to shift. In the early 1880's, a dam was constructed on the west side of Little Lake Boort to supply the Steam Trains and the growing town with water. This was known as the "Pumping Dam", mainly because water had to pumped to the Railway Station and later on to the Water Tower on the hill. All of the water for this dam came from the Loddon River down the Kinypanial Creek until the 1920's. Another part of the lake was banked off where the present swimming pool is, to create the first swimming pool. The pool was noted for having the biggest leaches in Victoria, Boort became known as having the best swimmers for years, this was due to the fact, that if you stopped swimming, you would be covered in leaches, everyone learnt to swim very fast very quickly!. Little Lake Boort is 72Ha and holds approximately 900Ml, it evaporates approximately 800MI a year. The Community and the Loddon Shire together over the years have secured a water entitlement of 900Ml which guarantees water for the

lake most years. This year, holiday makers are guaranteed a full lake until Easter. Little Lake Boort when full is 1.5 metres deep, there is no natural catchment, therefore all water is obtained through the GMW channel. Many of the tourists could not comprehend the evaporation rate until one of the members of Little Lake Boort Asset Committee explained in laymen terms, that in the summer the lake evaporates 3.5 slabs a second. Little Lake Boort has one of the most popular walking tracks in the Shire. The track is 3.7Km long with an average of 200 walkers a day during the week and many more at weekends. Boort receives many visitors from the Mallee, mainly during the summer, just to come and sit on green lawns and to have a picnic. Often Aquatic Plants develop on the bed of the lake causing a hindrance to Speed boats, solving this problem the Community built a specially designed boat to cut the Aquatic Plants off and auger them into the boat then dumping the load onto the bank. This assures that the speed boats are able to operate safely. At the moment the Committee is looking for operators to drive "Weed Boat Willie" if you are interested contact Barry Kennedy. The Little Lake Boort Asset Committee covered many items at the last meeting. The main ones were - maintaining the current water level until Easter when the lake will be partially drained for maintenance through winter. This maintenance includes beaching in Nolens Park and other areas. The Committee hopes to oil the Board Walk and the bridge near the Caravan Holiday Park well before Christmas. More sand will be placed along the beach in the Caravan Holiday Park, the Committee is looking into installing a Canoe Launch-



ing Pad as canoeing is now very popular on the lake. More parking is now needed near the Caravan Holiday Park, a suggestion was tidying up the area east of the park over the channel. There is possibly no better place in the Loddon Shire to have a break or a day visit than at the Boort Holiday Caravan Park on the shores of Little Lake Boort, where there are plenty of green lawns under shady trees, free electric BBQs and if there are children around, the Men's Shed members start up the Merry-Go-Round. The lake is also popular for fishing, canoeing, catching yabbies, bird watching and listening to the frogs in the evening.
