At its meeting last Tuesday (24 May), Council awarded the tender for the Pyramid Hill Streetscape project to Capeng Pty Ltd.

Works are anticipated to commence on the Pyramid Hill Streetscape Revitalisation Project in July.

The project aims to unify the township via themed works along the town approaches and pedestrian navigation. It will achieve this by improving pedestrian safety, linking key public spaces and providing additional landscaping and shade.

The project has been made possible thanks to \$800,000 in funding from the Victorian Government's Building Works package and Council.

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

Today (15 June) marks World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD), where individuals and organisations worldwide highlight the importance of the rights of older people, as prevention against the mistreatment and harm occurring in their communities.

WEAAD was officially recognised by the United Nations General Assembly in December 2011.

Elder abuse is any act which causes harm to an older person and is carried out by someone they know and trust such as a family member or friend. The abuse may be physical, social, financial, psychological or sexual and can include mistreatment and neglect. Rates of elder abuse are under reported, but the <u>Australian Institute of Family Studies</u> estimates up to 14 per cent of older people in Australia are affected.

The warning signs of elder abuse may include an older person seeming fearful, anxious or isolated. There may be injuries, or an absence of personal care. Unexplained changes to legal documents or finances are also of concern. Most elder abuse occurs behind closed doors, so it is important for loved ones to watch out for signs, listen and offer help.

Small Business Energy Saver Program

Sustainability Victoria, in partnership with the Central Victorian Greenhouse Alliance (CVGA) are encouraging small businesses to reduce their running costs and reduce possible emissions through the Small Business Energy Saver Program.

The program provides small businesses with a discount that covers up to 85 per cent of the full equipment and installation cost when upgrading to more energy-efficient equipment.

The CVGA can work with you to identify which equipment your business is eligible to be upgraded. To be eligible, small businesses must have one to 19 employees (full-time equivalent) and be in a commercial (non-residential) premises.

A range of equipment upgrades are eligible for the discount, including replacement of inefficient electric and gas hot water systems, upgrading to efficient room reverse cycle air-conditioners, installation of energy-efficient refrigerator display cabinets, and more.

Gear Up for Ag Health and Safety Program

Twenty two students from Year 8-10 were fortunate enough to attend the funded Gear Up for Ag program on Friday from 9am – 1pm. Organised by Angela Poxon at the NCLLEN and facilitated by 'The National Centre for Farmers Health' presenters Sally and Celia conducted an interactive and informative session.

The program's key objective is to engage students in a practical, fun and interactive way providing evidence based education that promotes health, wellbeing and safety within the agricultural sector. Embedding health and safety awareness is critical to maintaining the health and wellbeing of the next generation of farmers living and working together in the agriculture industry. Engaging students in safe practices will ensure a positive safety culture in future generations.

As part of the program students undertook;

An <u>online pre-training student survey</u> to develop a customised training to provide key health and safety education relevant to student's attitudes, behaviour, knowledge and exposures, at home and on the farm.

The education session which promoted health, wellbeing and safety in agriculture and included interactive demonstrations and class activities. For example, identification of local agricultural hazards, how working on farms and in agriculture can impact physical and mental wellbeing and ways to minimise risk of fatality, injury and illness on farms. It was great to see the students answering questions honestly and providing thoughtful discussion on a range of topics.

Each student was given a Personal Protective Equip-



ment (PPE) start-up kit with discussion on where and when to wear appropriate AS/NZS approved PPE.

The interactive demonstration of correct usage was a

highlight as the group covered volunteers Lucy Malone and Alex Cockerell with shaving cream, while fully kitted out in PPE, to discuss the importance of correct PPE usage.

Overall it was a valuable program that the students recognised as being important to their health and safety, especially on farms.





Queen Victoria Market

Boort District School Year 8 and 9 students travelled to the Queen Victoria Market to be immersed in the culinary delights it has to offer. Covid had cancelled the traditional Year 7 visits, the past two years, but it had been agreed with students the trip would go ahead when we could. The first taste test was the infamous American 'hot jam donuts'. 

As I drove past the lake at Boort, I happened to notice a gathering of pelicans, about twenty I would say. They were close together and I pondered what, if there was, the plural for pelicans. 


