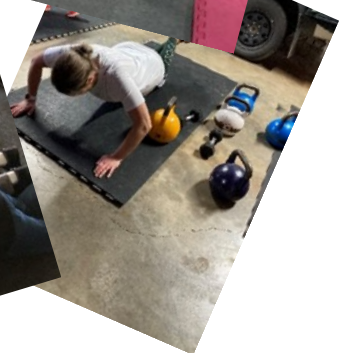
BBQ was a great success

Draft Community Local Law – submissions close at the end of August

I'd like to start this week's column with a reminder that submissions for the draft Community Local Law close Wednesday 31 August at 5pm. The draft Community Local Law follows a review of Council's existing and expired local laws (in accordance with the *Local Government Act 2020*), into a much simplified and easier to understand local law. It covers a range of laws, including Council land, streets and roads, private property, animals and pets, waste and recycling, permits and fees, and enforcement. I'd also like to make mention that there are a number of local laws in the draft document that have actually already been in effect for many years, and have not been changed. I encourage you to please go to Council's website and to view the Draft Community Local Law documents, including the document *Part C table – Local Law review*. This table provides a summary of the changes and rationale for each clause of the draft Community Local Law 2022. This includes whether there is no change to a law, minor change, significant change, a new law, or a law that has been removed or deleted. It also provides comment regarding any proposed changes and why. You can access the Draft Community Local Law and documents via Council's website:

You can also submit your comment to the draft Community Local Law via the webpage. Producers reminded to update Property Identification Code

Agriculture Victoria is reminding producers who have changed address, contact details or diversified their livestock to make sure they update their Property Identification Code (PIC). A PIC is the eight-character alphanumeric code allocated by Agriculture Victoria. Its purpose is for tracing and controlling disease and residue problems that may be detected, and for locating properties, and contacting owners and industry representatives. According to Agriculture Victoria PICs are also used for emergency relief and recovery activities within an impacted zone – for example, foot-and-mouth or lumpy skin diseases.

Registrations will open from 1 July for the Loddon Healthy Minds Network 2022 Suicide Prevention Forum (SPF22).

The forum, which will be held on Thursday 20 October from 9am to 3.30pm at the Inglewood Community Hub, will focus on suicide prevention strategies that work in rural areas.

A number of experts and speakers will present at the forum, giving insights into solutions and strategies to address rural mental health.

This includes renowned mental health speaker, author and radio broadcaster Craig Hamilton.

Craig, who was diagnosed with Bipolar Disorder in 2000, is one of Australia's most high-profile speakers regarding mental health and wellbeing.

A range of guest presenters will also speak at SPF22, providing strategies that practitioners, service providers, community members and volunteers alike will be able to put to immediate use in service and/or their community.

Loddon Shire Mayor Dan Straub said looking out for each other in local communities continued to be critical.

"As highlighted by the Loddon Healthy Minds Network – suicide prevention is everyone's business," Cr Straub said.

"This forum comes at a moment in time where mental health, including among our rural communities, is a crucial focal point.

"Given the impacts of the past two years, and the continued effects we're seeing in our community, helping ensure the wellbeing of our fellow community members is vital.

"I encourage everyone in our region who is concerned about mental health in rural communities, be it through their work, volunteering capacity or as a community member, to attend the forum," he added.

Early bird discount tickets for SPF22 will apply for registrations for the entire month of July.

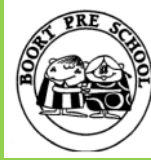

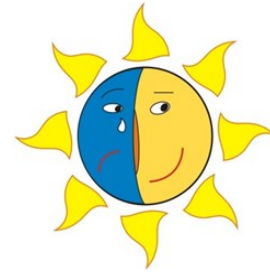

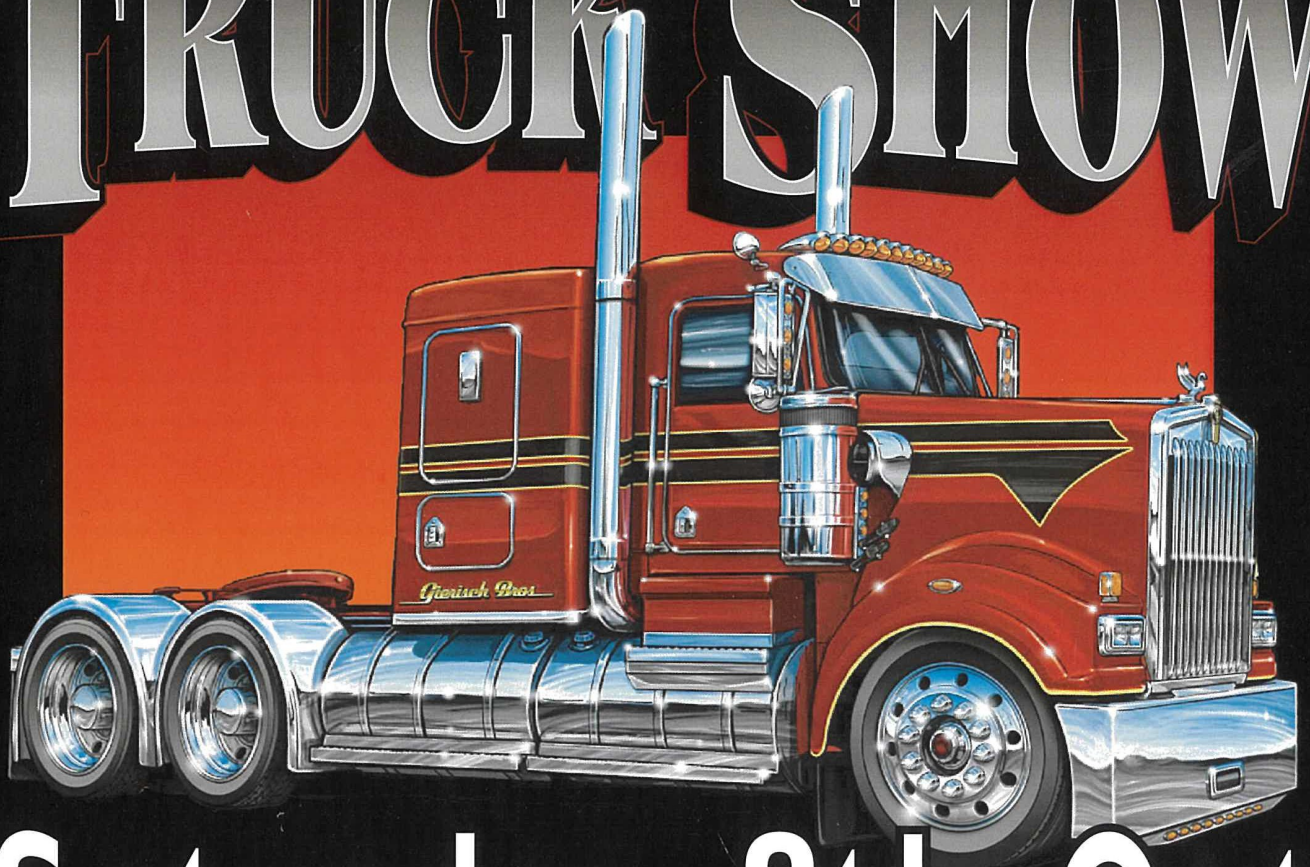
