Diabetes

Diabetes is a chronic condition in which the levels of glucose (sugar) in the blood are too high. Blood glucose levels are normally regulated by the hormone insulin, which is made by the pancreas. Diabetes occurs when there is a problem with this hormone and how it works in the body. Around 5.1 per cent of Australians aged 18 years or older have diabetes, the risk of diabetes increases with age.

There are several types of diabetes:

- **Type 1 diabetes** occurs when a person's own immune system breaks down the cells in the pancreas that produce insulin.
- **Type 2 diabetes** occurs when the body's cells do not respond effectively to insulin or lose the ability to produce enough insulin in the pancreas.
- **Gestational diabetes** occurs when a woman experiences high blood glucose levels during pregnancy. It usually goes away after the baby is born.

Pre-diabetes is where blood glucose levels are higher than usual, but not high enough for a diagnosis of diabetes.

What are the symptoms of diabetes?

Common symptoms of diabetes include:

- excessive thirst or hunger
- passing more urine than usual
- feeling tired and lethargic
- unexplained weight loss (for type 1), or gradual weight gain (for type 2)
- blurred vision

Can diabetes be prevented?

Healthy habits that can help prevent type diabetes include:

- healthy eating
- maintaining a healthy weight, or losing weight if you are overweight or obese
- regular physical activity
- quitting smoking
- reducing your alcohol intake (fewer than 4 standard drinks a day)

When should I see my doctor?

Diabetes is serious but can be managed well with a combination of medicines and lifestyle changes. Early diagnosis and treatment can also help to reduce the risk of more serious complications. Speak to your doctor if you are experiencing symptoms of diabetes or have concerns about your risk of diabetes



Diabetes emergency

If you are not sure if the patient has low or high blood sugar, give them a drink containing sugar (DO NOT use 'diet' soft drinks, eg Coke Zero, Pepsi Max). Giving any form of sugar can save a patient's life if blood sugar is low, and will not cause undue harm if blood sugar is high.

Signs and symptoms

High blood sugar

- excessive thirst
- tiredness
- blurred vision
- hot, dry skin
- smell of acetone on breath

Low blood sugar

- weakness, shaking
- sweating
- headache
- faintness, dizziness
- lack of concentration
- teariness or crying
- irritability or altered behaviour
- hunger
- numbness around the lips and fingers
- These can progress quickly to:
- slurred speech
- confusion
- loss of consciousness
- seizures

What to do

High blood sugar (hyperglycaemia)

- If the patient has medication, ask if they need assistance administering it. Only help the patient if they request it.
- 2 Encourage the patient to drink water.
- 3 Seek medical aid if symptoms worsen.
- 4 If the patient has not yet been diagnosed with diabetes, encourage them to seek medical aid.

Low blood sugar (hypoglycaemia)

- Help the patient to sit or lie in a comfortable position.
- 2 Reassure the patient.
- 3 Loosen any tight clothing.
- 4 Give the patient sugar, such as fruit juice or a soft drink (NOT 'diet' eg Coke Zero, Pepsi Max), sugar, jellybeans, glucose tablets.
- 5 Continue giving sugar every 15 minutes until the patient recovers.
- 6 Follow with carbohydrates, eg a sandwich, milk, fresh or dry fruit, or dry biscuits and cheese.
- 7 If there is no improvement in symptoms or the patient becomes unconscious, call Triple Zero (000) for an ambulance.

Inglewood outdoor fitness station to launch

Councillor Wendy Murphy will officially open a new outdoor fitness station at the Inglewood Recreation Reserve this Friday 16 December at 10am.

Led and funded by the Healthy Loddon Campaspe initiative, the equipment provides a free opportunity for locals and visitors to be physically active.

Equipment includes a balance beam, aerobic cycle, pull downs, leg press, chest press, body twist and step-ups.

The Inglewood outdoor fitness station is the fourth to be installed in Loddon Shire through the Healthy Loddon Campaspe initiative, with existing stations also in Boort, Pyramid Hill and Wedderburn.

Installing outdoor exercise equipment was identified as an action in goal 4 of the Inglewood Community Plan 2021 - 2031.

The results from the 2019 Active Living Census highlighted that 56 per cent of females and 53 per cent of males who reside within the Loddon Shire want to exercise more. The new exercise equipment will enable more people living in and visiting the region to be more active more often.





FIREARM STORAGE

Firearm storage conditions are changing in 2022



Storage requirements for category A, B, C, D and general category handguns are changing on 30 August 2022.


These changes mean that firearm owners will be required to ensure that their storage arrangements meet or exceed the following conditions:

- Firearms must be stored in a purpose-built steel storage receptacle.
- The steel must be of a thickness of at least 1.6mm.
- If the receptacle weighs less than 150 kilograms when it is empty it must be bolted to the structure of the premises.
- The receptacle must be locked with a lock of sturdy construction when the firearm is stored in it.
