Boort Golf News

The ladies Wednesday golf has seen keen competition between the ladies playing in the Club Championship, which has been held over 3 rounds of golf during the month of June. The last round of the Championship was held on Wednesday, with the winner in B-Grade being Sally Keeble, just 2 strokes ahead of Lorraine Linehan in second place.

The A-Grade was won by Di Johnston with Gaye Sim as runner-up. The 2 champions will play in the Kara-Kara Champions of Champions which will be held on Thursday the 29th of June over 18 holes at Charlton.

This was played in conjunction with the Shield and Association Events at Charlton and extra club members will be travelling to Charlton to make a team for these golfing events.

This week saw the last round of the Men's Club Championships and it was great to see 13 members battle it out across two grades in difficult conditions after more soaking rain during the week. In the A-Grade, Andrew Kane had his best round for the year with 4-under off the stick to register a nett 68, three ahead of Robert Johnston on 71, with Craig Allison a further two behind on 73. In the B-Grade, Grant Tooth racked up his first win of the year with nett 70, three clear of Graeme Ball.

In the club Championships Andrew took out the A-Grade ahead of Stuart Tweddle and Tim Lanyon, while Robert Johnston won the B-Grade, successfully fending off Alister McDougal and Kevin Linehan. In the Weaver Cup, Time Lanyon's consistency earned him the trophy, with Stuart in second and Kevin coming third. Following the results of presentation, players and guests then enjoyed the traditional Pizza Night.

The **Annual Farmer's 4Ball** event on Friday the 30th of June, sponsored by Nutrien Ag, was a great turnout of 36 golfers. In the women's event, locals Gaye Sim and Di Johnston with 33 points won a countback from Beth Thompson and Julie McClennan from Wycheproof.

In the men's event, Mark Perryman and Adam Potter had a brilliant 48 points, five clear of runners-up Damian Lanyon and Paul Harris, with Kelvin Mayberry and Craig Allison coming third with 41 points. In the Nearest The Pins on the Par 3's, Gary Lake and Glen Bartels, both from Barham, took home a prize each, as did Lorraine Linehan while the closest 2 shots on the 18 was Harvey Poxon who went home with a prize.

Boort Aerodrome History

Boort is situated in northern Victoria between Melbourne and Mildura in that line of 143.43 Longitude & 36.08 Latitude.

Boort has a population of approx. 800. It is popular for large olive plantations, wheat, sheep, cattle and tomatoes.

Boort Aerodrome was established in early 1981 by Max & Joy Manuel and named Biggin Hill after the famous Biggin Hill Air Base in England during the war.

In May 1981 the first Flyin was staged with 32 aircraft arriving on Sunday, organized by Max & Joy Manuel.

In 1995 Boort Aviation Group was formed by John Norman President and John Bridgewater Secretary, and became branch of the Mid Murray Flying Club.

Then, in early 1997, the Shire and the local community & state government purchased the aerodrome from Max & Joy Manuel.

Later in 1997 the Boort Aerodrome Management Committee was formed with Rob Hosking Secretary and Murray Lanyon Chairman.

We also introduced the Flyin's. There were 178 aircraft that landed and we served 487 meals on Saturday night. The meals consisted of spit roast, Lamb pork beef and vegetables with sweets to follow.

It used to take 2.5 hours to carve and serve the meat between Roy Stomann, Kay Boland, and Ken Loader.

In May 1998 the Aerodrome was officially opened by Dr Golf Letts.

The runway consists of a grass surface which are [280 degrees & 100 degrees] direction, with pilot lights manufactured by Dr John Findlow, with the help of Boort Aviation Group installation.

The club has approx. 25 members.

Since 1942, within 20kms of Boort there have been 78 pilots learning to fly. This was up to November 2008. At this date there are 14 flying.

The Shire in conjunction with the Aerodrome Management Committee built a Pilot lounge. This was finished in July 2008 and was opened on the 3rd of May 2009 at our annual Flyin.

This building serves pilots coming in from far and wide, as well as air ambulance, olive investors and local pilots.






