WORLD RECORD ATTEMPT

Local Bradley Haw is confident he has broken the world record for paddling a pumpkin the longest distance. Starting at 11am on Good Friday and finishing in the evening of Easter Sunday, Bradley paddled his home-grown, hollowed out pumpkin down the Murray River from Torrumbarry Weir to Nursery Bend, covering 67km, 4 km beyond the current record.

Bradley's workmate Fred has been by Bradley's side, helping him grow the 298kg pumpkin, and crewing the support boat. Bradley and Fred's families also provided support.

It was a trial-and-error journey, with the hole cut into the pumpkin on the first morning, and a series of adjustments made along the way. This included more carving out to make room for Bradley's legs, and a yoga ball triumphing as the best seating arrangement.

By Day 3 the pumpkin was rotting and the stench was horrendous. This just inspired Bradley to give it bis all and he put in 12 hours of paddling that day to surpass

Official advice about the world record is pending, but Bradley is pretty proud of himself: "My first go at sport, and I'm a world champion!"

The Fire Danger Period for Loddon Shire was lifted on Monday 8 April 2024. The CFA is reminding community members that although the Fire Danger Period has ended, it is still important to ensure that local conditions are safe for any burn-off you're considering undertaking. School Student Broadband Initiative

The School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) powered by nbn is an Australian Government program that offers free home internet to up to 30,000 families with school aged children until December 2025. To be eligible for SSBI program, families must meet the following criteria:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including Prep).

 Not have an active nbn network internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.

- Live in a premises that can access the nbn network via a standard connection.

- Not have had an active nbn connection during the previous 14 days.


