Boort District Health Transport Services

Local Transport Services

Did you know... BDH Home and Community Care Services provide a local transport service for shopping/paying bills in Boort.

This service operates using the hospital car each Friday morning. The car is driven by a volunteer driver. The client specifies pick up times and is transported down the street and home by the volunteer driver for a fee of \$3.00

A second local transport is also provided to transport clients, who have no other means, to the local medical clinic for appointments.

The transport can be arranged prior to the day and a volunteer driver will pick up the client and transport them to the clinic. Following the appointment the driver will be contacted to pick up the client and transport them home. The fee for this service is also \$3.00.

Community Transport For Specialist Medical Appointments

Boort District Health provides a transport service, including car and driver, for specialist medical appointments within a 120 km distance of Boort.

Who can use this service?

This service is available for existing clients or community residents, who meet the criteria and **do not** have family/friends available to accompany them.

All enquiries and bookings for this service should be directed to Maree Stringer at Boort District Health on 54515200. The fees for this service are \$40.00 for a trip to Bendigo and \$27.00 to Kerang. These fees can often be partly recouped by using the Victorian Patient Transport Assistance Scheme (VPTAS).

This scheme aims to help people in a rural setting overcome some of the financial pressures of having to travel significant distances to access some medical services.

Information and forms regarding VPTAS are available from the Day Centre.

Unit 1 History Jewish Holocaust Museum excursion

On Monday 4th May, the Unit 1 History class travelled to Melbourne to visit the Jewish Holocaust Museum. After arriving at Flinders Street Station, students made their way to the Roule Galette creperie in Flinders Lane for lunch, which consisted of a great selection of French cuisine.

The group then headed out to Jewish Holocaust Museum in Elsternwick, where they initially viewed a very informative video on the Holocaust and took part in an education session. This was followed by a guided tour of the museum and free time to explore the exhibits. The highlight of the day was certainly spending half an hour listening to the story of John, an 86 year old Polish Holocaust survivor who had lost most of his family at the hands of the Nazis and then managed to survive a range of dangerous situations across Poland and Germany during the war, including being imprisoned at Auschwitz. Students were very fortunate to have the chance to hear John's story and found the experience very valuable and moving.

CURRENTLY TAKING EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST FOR ROADSHOW BOOKINGS BETWEEN JULY 2015 AND JUNE 2016

As part of the Victorian Government's Anzac Centenary program (2014-2018) a free community roadshow is travelling throughout Victoria. The roadshow includes storytelling, live theatre performances, video, guest speakers and interactive content. Each attendee takes home an Anzac Centenary Commemoration Information Pack, which contains a brief history of Victoria's contribution to the war effort, profiles of Victoria Cross recipients and a small token of remembrance.

Travelling to communities and secondary schools across the state, this free roadshow has been created to educate Victorians about WWI history, encourage them to discover personal connections and inspire them to initiate their own Centenary projects.

If you are interested in hosting a community roadshow, visit http://anzaccentenary.vic.gov.au/journeyofremembrance/ and fill out the Community Event Expression of Interest Form. Community events run for approximately 75-90 minutes and conclude with the opportunity to share stories with other members from your community and research WWI connections. Please note, you must have a minimum of 50 attendees and provide the venue e.g. Town Hall, Community Centre or RSL Club. Those who have previously hosted a roadshow may apply again.

METAL SCULPTURE STRATEGY FOR BOORT

The Boort Development and Boort Tourism groups have formulated a long term strategic approach to capitalise on the great exposure that Star Spanner Sculpture Gardens is providing to Boort and district.

We are extremely fortunate to have John Piccoli at Boort (the Spanner Man), as he is now generating more than 5,000 visitors a year predominantly through word of mouth, with very little if any advertising. His profile has grown dramatically over the last 18 months, so now is an ideal time for Boort to promote itself as a great destination for those interested in world class metal sculpture.

Our strategy is based on:

- ♦ Boort Sculpture By The Lake competition, which has become an integral part of both the Boort A&P Show and the Naturally Loddon Festival. Each year this metal sculpture competition has grown, attracting high quality works of art from entrants across Victoria.
- ♦ The winner of the 2013 competition was purchased by Boort Development, and this stunning metal **Dragonfly Sculpture** is now on display in a beautiful wetland setting on the edge of Boort Lake.
- ♦ Boort Sculpture By The Lake workshops are now run each year, where a metal sculptor works with volunteers from the community, turning donated scrap metal into wonderful pieces of outdoor art. Rusty The Redfin was created in 2014 and he will be installed on the lake edge for public viewing.
- Placement of the spectacular new **Piccoli Spanner Sculpture** into Nolens Park.
- Development of a Metal Sculpture Trail beginning at Nolens Park and continuing around the lake foreshore, with associated signage.

There is great potential for this world class Metal Art to bring many thousands of visitors to Boort on an ongoing basis, but more than that our strategy aims to keep these increasing numbers of visitors in Boort for longer than just a day trip. We are combining two of the Boort district's greatest attractions – Little Lake Boort and Metal Sculpture. In time this can be a game changer for Boort, as these wonderful metal sculpture assets will assist in stimulating economic activity, that will then flow on to new investment into the town.
