

Daisy, connecting women

SUNSMART APP

Set up a sun protection alert and receive daily reminders for the times of day when UV reaches a level that can damage your skin and eyes, as well as two-hour reminders to re-apply sunscreen. Use the sunscreen calculator to find out how much sunscreen you need to apply, taking account of your size and clothing.
