

list all the organisations, clubs and groups which benefited from your involvement, contribution and professionalism. This is greatly appreciated and we all are richer for your participation.



## **Bridging the Gap**

Boort Historical Society's collection of Aboriginal artefacts is in the process of being catalogued for entry into the records of the Victorian Aboriginal Heritage Register. As the Aboriginal objects are all from the Boort district, we have been assured that they will remain in the Court House Museum in the possession of Boort Historical Society Inc. for viewing by our visitors.

Our members are learning such a lot from the stories of the catalogue team – Jida Gulpilil (Director - Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation) son of actor and artist David Gulpilil) and Dr Diana Smith (Program Manager - Cultural Heritage) who have a vast knowledge of Aboriginal history and geology.

Diana enters the information which Jida provides onto a laptop which looks out of place amongst the ancient collection of artefacts from our past. Each item is measured, weighed, photographed and colour coded. Jida can be seen examining the items in the photograph, and he is able to tell our members some history of the practical uses of the various grinding stones, stone axes, ceremonial sticks, boomerangs, waddies, etc.

A pair of decorated sticks are amongst the more unusual items held in the Museum and they were found on a Gredgwin



property 78 years ago in the mulga scrub. Jida explained that they were possibly used to beat possum skin drums during ceremonies.

If anyone would like to have a private collection catalogued this can be arranged by contacting Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation. Aboriginal objects and places are recorded in the way described, unless there are any human remains or special ceremonial objects which by law require special management and protection, with this process managed separately by the Secretary, Office of Aboriginal Affairs Victoria.

A reminder that the Court House Museum is open each Friday from 2:00 - 4:00pm.


#### A SENSE OF ANTICIPATION

The club program of fixtures for the men and ladies will be available at the club house at the commencement of the golf season. Please remember your memberships as clubs cannot function without adequate finances.





- Opportunity to join current volunteers



## **Cat and Dog Registrations**

Cat and dog registration time has rolled around again, and renewal notices are arriving in responsible pet owners' mail boxes.

Renewal notices, to be paid by April 10, have been posted to the owners of 2,260 dogs and 369 cats registered with Loddon Shire Council in the last financial year.

Sadly we know there are many more cats and dogs within the Shire which we have no record of, and are unable to return should they go astray.

During the last financial year, Council impounded 137 cats and not a single one was able to be identified and returned to its owner.

This figure was better for dogs with 18 of the 35 impounded being safely returned home, but clearly there is room for improvement.

The simple fact is if a cat or dog isn't micro-chipped and registered they cannot be identified and reunited with their owner.

In the best interests of your pet, your family and the community, please ensure your registration renewal is paid by the due date.

All cats and dogs over three months of age are required by law to be micro-chipped or registered.

If you have an unregistered pet in your care, please take this opportunity to contact Council and rectify the situation, without fear of penalty, as soon as possible.
