Boort Development Committee Report

We are working closely with Loddon Shire Council to deliver a new and enlarged **Playground at Nolens Park**. This will provide a great boost for young families as the new playground equipment will be state-of-the-art, so kids will love coming to the park to explore the various play components. We plan to add some nature play style elements as well, which can be built locally from timber, such as balancing beams and stepping stones. The total budget for this project is about \$100,000 and we expect works to commence within 2 months.

Another project soon to kick off is an upgrade to **Federation Walk**. The existing light poles will be removed and new attractive arch style poles and lights will be installed – these have been ordered already. BDC also plans to bring the Prime Minister plaques up to date. So this area will be greatly enhanced and the budget for the upgrade is \$26,000.

Boort Development Committee members have been busy lately working on the expansion of the **Metal Sculpture Trail** around Little Lake Boort. The new **Cormorant** (or Shag) sculpture now stands proudly on a large granite boulder adjacent to the Croquet Lawn, so if you haven't seen him yet get down there and take a look. It's perhaps the best sculpture so far! The safety fence around the Cormorant is under construction and will be finished in a couple of weeks. Some landscaping has also been completed to improve the area around our Rusty Redfin sculpture. The next step is to create some signage for the Sculpture Trail – this work is in hand and funds are available – so BDC will arrange and install the new signage over the next 2-3 of months. We believe this growing sculpture trail can become a significant tourist attraction for Boort that will help bring more visitors and tourists.

CFA Volunteers worried

CFA Volunteers would like to keep the public informed of the current status and some questions to ask.

CFA is a "Volunteer Community based Emergency Service Organisation" which is supported by career staff. There are 60,000 Volunteers & 1,800 career staff protecting Victoria (and includes 50% of greater Melbourne). CFA Volunteers have NO issues with Paid Career Staff's pay and conditions.

CFA Volunteers and some staff have issues with up to 50 clauses of Veto.

These 50 clauses will cause the CFA's head, the "Chief Officer" to be unable to make decisions about CFA, he or she will have to ensure decisions are made with approval of the United Fire Fighters Union (UFU). The UFU represent some 800 paid firefighters.

Volunteers (and Volunteer Fire Brigades Victoria - CFA Volunteer Association) make up 97% of CFA's workforce.

CFA Volunteers have NOT been consulted! There is a Volunteer Charter that states "Volunteers MUST be consulted by Government, CFA and other bodies and this is legislated.

Local MP, The Hon Peter Walsh is supportive of CFA and has the following statement below on his webpage - www.peterwalsh.org.au

"Victorians rely on volunteer firefighters to protect our communities when we need them most. Now our CFA volunteers need your support.

Daniel Andrews wants to hand control of the CFA to the United Firefighters Union (UFU). This deal will give the UFU control over CFA operations and remove the rights of volunteers and CFA management.

Many of our local CFA volunteers have contacted me, deeply concerned about what the UFU's demands will mean for our local fire service.

Please sign the petition to show your support for our CFA volunteers"

Go to Peter Walsh's webpage and sign the petition to show your support.

The previous CFA Board, Emergency Services Minister, CEO and CFA Leadership team have all indicated that the proposed EBA is illegal.

Why did Premier Andrews allow Minister Garrett to resign?

Why did CEO Lucinda Nolan resign?

How did the Government appoint a new CFA Board so quickly? And how did the new Board appoint a new CEO within four hours?

In memory of her, I will be taking part in the Daniher's Drive to help raise awareness and vital funds for MND. I will be supporting my cousin Naomi Beasley, by joining two of her lifelong girl friends Amelia Costin and Kylie Tate-Smith on the 2016 Drive. The drive commences in Melbourne on the 13th of October and travels north through Victoria's high country to Mt Hotham, then continues on through Victoria's south eastern corner to Sale and across to Cowes, returning to Melbourne on the 16th of October.

Our mission is to honour Lorna and make a difference to those suffering from MND. Our dream is that researchers will one day find a cure for MND.

Parks Victoria and the Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation have released the draft management plan for Lake Boort Reserve for public comment. Thanks again to the many Boort residents who provided valuable input to developing the draft at Open House engagement sessions held at the Boort Resource and Information Centre in November 2015 and to everyone who filled in the on-line survey.

Lake Boort Reserve is a culturally significant landscape. It has over 400 Aboriginal scar trees as well as cooking mounds, camping sites and areas where stone tools were worked. Lake Boort is particularly special to the Dja Dja Wurrung people.

We are seeking your comment on the plan's recommendations which include:

Protecting and interpreting the intriguing cultural sites of Lake Boort

Revitalising Lake Boort as a thriving wetland

Exploring opportunities for nature-based and cultural tourism that may be offered by a Dja Dja Wurrung business

Exploring new walking and cycle tracks, and rationalising other tracks

Designating a camping area and providing visitor information

Park zoning and duck hunting




