MOBILE LIBRARY SERVICES

The mobile library service will be finishing on the 23rd of December 2016. Seven new Library Agencies will be established in the Loddon Shire and northern areas of the City of Greater Bendigo. The agencies are expected to be up and running in February 2017. We will continue to send out bulletins with up to date information about our progress.

Library Agency Locations

The Library Agency location has been selected in Boort, it will be at the Boort Resource and Information Centre.

Library staff will be visiting each agency regularly. Our staff will deliver reserves and rotate and refresh the collection to make sure current and popular collection items (like books and DVDs) are frequently updated at the Library Agencies.

What are the benefits of a Library Agency?

Library Agencies will offer similar services to the Mobile Library, with the opportunity for longer hours of opening and program delivery. Browsing collections will be smaller however the same opportunity to reserve items will be available.

There are significant advantages to having a permanent Library Agency location.

Library users can browse the collection or search the library catalogue and reserve any of the 300,000 items across the entire collection.

Reserves will be delivered to agencies regularly for patrons to pick up.

Library Agencies will be open longer hours making it easier for locals to drop off returns, pick up reserves, browse and borrow from the collection at a time that is convenient.

Patrons can also sit and read, browse magazines or catch up with friends.

Wi-fi and internet facilities will be available at most agencies offering much longer opening hours. Library Programs such as Storytime for kids or Digital Literacy for adults can be hosted at the Library Agencies.

Due to level crossing removal works, the following service alterations will take place.



Bendigo and Echuca

All train services will be replaced by road coaches between Southern Cross and Sunbury and connect with trains between Sunbury, Bendigo and Echuca.

Swan Hill

All services will be replaced by road coaches between Southern Cross and Bendigo and connect with train services to/from Swan Hill.

Connecting coach services will be managed locally. Delays of up to 40 minutes may be expected.

Assistance available for farmers

Farmers experiencing financial hardship are urged to contact the Rural Financial Counselling Service Victoria – North West for assistance.

The RFCS provides free, confidential on farm assistance to eligible farmers by experienced counsellors that help farmers work out their financial position and options available. Counsellors can help with budgeting, refinancing loans, negotiating with creditors, and assessing government support programs.

Counsellors can help you access government assistance programs available:

Farm Household Allowance. Income support payments to eligible farmers and their partner experiencing financial hardship, administered by Department of Human Services. Payments up to \$24,825 pa per couple or \$13,746 pa for singles plus a Health Care Card, for up to three years.

Farm Business Concessional Loans. Low interest (2.47%) loans up to \$1 million, being up to 50% of farm debt, available to dairy farmers and any farmers recovering from drought. Administered by Rural Finance.

Dairy Development Grants. Grants of up to \$5,000 per dairy farm applicant/business to implement on farm infrastructure improvements that assist business rebuilding, restructure and production efficiencies. Farmers must contribute an equal amount. Administered by Rural Finance.

Farm Debt Mediation. A scheme that makes it compulsory for banks and other creditors to offer mediation to farmers before commencing debt recovery proceedings on farm mortgages on farm land and farm equipment. Our experienced counsellors work closely with farmers during this process.

Australian Taxation Office. Offers deferred payment plans for farm businesses unable to meet their tax obligations and that are experiencing financial hardship.

Farmers are urged not to self-assess their eligibility for the assistance programs available and to contact our service on **1300 769 489** for a Rural Financial Counsellor to come and see you. Local offices are in Pyramid Hill, Bendigo and Swan Hill.


