More Night Coaches are on their way

Minister for Public Transport Jacinta Allan announced more Friday and Saturday late night V/Line services with new Night Coach timetables beginning on Friday 24 November.

New late evening coaches will also run from Bendigo, Seymour and Traralgon to Melbourne, stopping in selected towns along the way and arriving at Southern Cross Station at 12:40 am.

Coaches from Melbourne will only drop off customers on request at most stops and the stopping patterns of most Night Coach services will change.

The changes to Night Coach services on Bendigo line are:

A new 10:20 pm coach service from Bendigo to Melbourne will stop in town at Kyneton and Gisborne and at Woodend and Sunbury stations.

A new 1:05am coach service from Melbourne to Bendigo.

New stops in town at Kyneton and Gisborne – coaches will still stop at Kyneton and Gisborne stations on request. Stops at Riddells Creek, Gisborne, Woodend, Kyneton, Castlemaine and Kangaroo Flat stations will be drop-off on request only.

VICROADS - Update to Learner Log Book Hours

Please be advised that as of the 1st of November, all learner drivers under the age of 21 who are issued with a learner permit on or after that date will be subject to different night time driving experience requirements.

The current requirement is that 10 hours of supervised night driving practice must be obtained (120 hours of supervised driving practice in total) before a learner attempts the practical driving test. The new requirement will see the night time driving experience requirement increase to 20 hours.

This does **NOT** mean that the total number of supervised driving hours will increase. Learner drivers will still be required to complete a minimum of 120 hours of total supervised driving, it is only the amount of night time driving that will increase.

Worksafe Safety Initiative Award.

Boort Netball Club (BNC) have cleaned up at the recent Netball Victoria state awards in Melbourne. BNC were shortlisted as a finalist in the category of 'Worksafe Safety Initiative Award'. Boort were equal winners with Ouyen United Football Netball Club.

BNC were recognised as being committed to providing a safe, inclusive place to play netball where community wellbeing is paramount. Bnc have primarily focused on providing a new second court for juniors, with a playable surface and safe surrounds. They installed new lighting to meet safety standards and ensured correct training of medical staff is up to date, amongst others. This was done mainly through fundraising.

Outgoing BNC President Jane Hosking, stated

'The award feels like this recognition is the culmination for all the fundraising and hard work that has happily been taken on by our club members and the wider community. We have never sat around waiting for grants, instead everyone has worked together for the good of our community.'

Life member Margaret Nelson, reiterated Jane's thoughts, and indicated that BNC should be extremely proud of themselves and be proud that we have such wonderful and safe facilities'.

With the official declaration of the Fire Danger Period for the Loddon Shire Council area beginning on Friday 17 November, it's important you know what you can and can't do during this time. This is particularly vital as we look towards the Christmas and New Year holidays.

During the Fire Danger Period several fire restrictions and regulations apply, including around campfires and barbecues, burning off and other activities.

You can find out what you can or can't do during the Fire Danger Period (and on days of Total Fire Ban) by visiting the CFA's Can I or Can't I information at cfa.vic.gov.au/can or by calling the VicEmergency Hotline on 1800 226 226.



National Skin Cancer Action Week 2017

November 19-25 2017

Each year Cancer Council Australia and the Australasian College of Dermatologists come together for National Skin Cancer Action Week.

With two in three Australians diagnosed with skin cancer by age 70, this week is a time when we remind Australians of the importance of sun protection and early skin cancer detection.

More than 2000 people in Australia die from skin cancer each year and Cancer Council estimates that Australia spends more than \$1 billion per year treating skin cancer, with costs increasing substantially over the past few years.

Yet most skin cancers can be prevented by the use of good sun protection.

Skin Cancer Action Week is a time when we remind Australians to slip on sun-protective clothing, slop on SPF30 (or higher) broad-spectrum, water-resistant sunscreen, slap on a broad-brimmed hat, seek shade and slide on sunglasses.

A combination of these measures, along with getting to know your skin and regularly checking so you can pick up on any changes, are the key to reducing your skin cancer risk.

BOORT PROBUS CLUB

At the October meeting of Boort Probus, Mrs Melva Matthews of Korong Vale, gave us a very interesting talk on the life of bees and honey production.

A most gifted and talented speaker, Melva described how bees are a perfect community with the drones, the workers and the Queen living in each hive.

Worker bees fly up to 145,000 klms to produce 1 kg of honey and live for only 6 weeks as foragers. A Queen can live for 7 years and a drone for 6-10 months.



Melva demonstrated how the honey is extracted using a 'smoker' to calm the bees before working on the hive.

The wax by-product of the beehives has many purposes. Matthews honey wax is used on the thread which stitches Australian cricket balls.


