




BOORT DANCE GROUP

Hard Waste Collection

Loddon Shire Council will be conducting a kerbside hard waste collection day during March 2018. Residents within the township boundaries (excluding business) of Boort, Pyramid Hill, Mitiamo, Dingee, Serpentine, Borung, Wychitella, Korong Vale, Wedderburn, Inglewood, Bridgewater, Newbridge, Tarnagulla, Laanecoorie and Eddington may place items (e.g. whitegoods, old bed frames etc.) out on the nature strip on Sunday 4 March 2018 (not before) and Council staff will collect and remove these items commencing Monday 5 March 2018.

Residents in the Logan area may deposit hard waste at a collection point located on the Logan Kingower Road opposite the Avoca Forest Hotel and Fenton's Creek residents may leave hard waste at a collection point located adjacent to the Fenton's Creek Hall on Sunday 4 March 2018. This hard waste will also be collected and removed commencing Monday 5 March 2018.

Items are to be sorted into piles, i.e. metal items, recyclable items and white goods. Total volume is not to exceed 1m3 in size. Excessive or unsorted piles will not be collected.

Please note that perishables, tyres, oils, batteries, paints and chemicals, car parts, mattresses, TVs, computers/monitors and garbage will not be picked up.


Boort Angling Club Notes

Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month: February

Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month is held each year in Australia to raise awareness of the signs and symptoms of ovarian cancer.

Ovarian Cancer is still the deadliest women's cancer. Every day in Australia four women are diagnosed with ovarian cancer and three will die from the disease.

Symptoms:

- Abdominal or pelvic pain
- Increased abdominal size or persistent abdominal bloating
- Needing to urinate often or urgently
- Feeling full after eating a small amount



Increased Risk factors:

Age - most common in women aged over 50, but can also affect women of all ages.

Genetics & Family History - women who have two or more relatives from the same side of her family affected by ovarian, or ovarian and breast cancer can increase the risk.

<u>Child-bearing history</u> - women who have not had children, unable to have children, never used oral contraceptives or have had children over the age of 30.

Endometriosis - women who have suffered from this condition

<u>Lifestyle</u> - smoking, overweight or eating a high fat diet can increase the risk.

Hormonal - including early puberty (menstruating before 12) or late menopause (onset after 50).

Treatment:

Treatment of ovarian cancer usually involves a combination of surgery and chemotherapy. Less often, treatment may include radiotherapy.

Treatment is best managed by a gynaecological oncologist.

Inglewood Advertiser, 12 March 1918

BATHING AT BOORT, WHAT THE MAN SAW, COUNCIL FINDS FOOD FOR FRIVOLITY.

At last week's meeting of the Gordon Shire Council the following letter was received from John Lewis, Boort:
- I desire to draw your attention to that part of Boort lake used by the bathers of Boort as it is dangerous to the travelling public, more especially to ladies driving vehicles.

Bathers rushing out from under the bridge in a semi nude state give the horses a start and as you are all aware most are women and not the best at handling horses when frightened.

I would ask you for your influence on behalf of the travelling public and myself to the north side of the pumping plant before a serious accident occurs. —

Cr. Coutts: I went several times to Boort but never had the luck to see them. (Laughter.)

The President: Mr. Lewis mentioned this mater to me and I told him he had better put it before the council.

One box seems to be a bit close. The best thing would be to get the engineer to report on it. -

The Engineer: Do you mean to have me report on the semi nude or on the other part? (Laughter.)

The President: Yes, on the other part, (Laughter), A lot of horses shy there. A Councillor: No wonder, (Laughter) Cr. Coutts: We had best let the president attend to this matter himself and report on it. (Laughter.) He might see if the box could be removed.

Cr. Malone: The trouble is that bathers and children come out from under the bridge and the horses shy. If the bathers would keep a respectable distance from the bridge it would be all right.

Cr. Cable: Some people spoke to me about it and I said we had nothing to do with the bathing boxes. We better leave it in the hands of the president. Cr. Cable you would like to have the secretary with you then (laughter.)

The President: Yes, I'd feel safer. (Laughter.) I would be in a better position to recommend.

A Councillor: It is a touchy subject, as you'll have to deal with the ladies.

Cr. Barnes: (who was enjoying the conversation too well to interrupt before): I would suggest that the president take snapshots. (Laughter.)


(It is fair to say that the council did not take the statement about the semi-nude seriously, knowing that such a state did not exist, particularly as the section referred to is that occupied by the ladies.










What's happening with recycling

You may have heard (or read) recent reports of potential impacts on the recycling industry, after China placed restrictions on receiving recycling from Australia. This is not currently impacting Loddon Shire's kerbside recycling collections.







According to the Loddon Mallee Waste and Resource Recovery Group, Victorians have a great record when it comes to recycling. Since 2001, the amount of recyclable household material diverted from landfill has increased by 70 per cent.

Overall, Victoria recovers up to 70 per cent of its waste, with almost eight million tonnes of valuable materials being diverted from landfill each year.

One of the best ways you can help keep resources out of landfill is to buy recycled products, which helps close the recycling loop. Choosing Australian-made recycled office paper and 100 per cent recycled toilet tissue are easy options for any household or workplace.

CHILDREN'S CONCESSION MYKI TICKETING CHANGE

People aged 17 and 18 are eligible to travel on a *Child* myki and pay a concession fare, and the age range for children needing to carry a myki has been increased to five-years-old.

The changes, effective from Monday 30 January, mean that the age range for *Child* ticketing will be from five to 18 years inclusive.

Anyone within this age range can travel on a concession myki and pay a discounted fare. They will also be classified as a *Child* on a V/Line Family Traveller ticket.

Authorised Officers may ask for age verification from customers not in school uniform. The following forms of identification will be accepted as age verification:

- PTV ID card
- · concession etitlement such as a Health Care Card
- government-issued proof of age including:
 - *learner permit (including interstate and international)
 - *driver licence (including interstate and international)
 - *Proof of Age card (including interstate)
 - *KeyPass card (issued by Australia Post
 - *Passport.

School and tertiary institution issued ID cards are not accepted as proof of concession entitlement.
