

Boort Historical Society Inc. DID YOU KNOW?

100 years ago, in December 1918, Boort Standard,

The Season's Crops - On Monday the first load of wheat for the season was delivered at Boort. It was grown by Mr. W. Osborne and taken delivery of by Mr Geo. Kirkham. The grain -Federation- was of fine sample and the yield is said to be good. General harvest operations are not yet in full swing, but those crops which have been harvested both oats and wheat show an excellent sample and good average result. The storm on Monday however played havoc with the unstripped oats and only about a third of the former yield is being harvested. Boort School Honors - The senior scholars of the Boort School were very successful at the recent annual examinations. Nine candidates were presented for the merit certificate and eight of these passed fully. The other candidate failed in one subject only, for which she will be given another trial. The successful candidates were Lena Butterworth, Elsie dinner, Madge Gawne, Ross Graham, Florrie Hindson, Ella Pickering, Rene Story and Millie Weatheritt. Sixteen candidates sat for the qualifying examination and thirteen of these passed fully. The scholars who passed were Gertie Baker, Jack Cable, Ethel Day, May Dinner, Dorrie Fairbairn, Ken Graham, Connie Murphy, Mary O'Donohue, Alex Paton, Annie Rye, Alice Rodier, May Weatheritt and Daisy Yole. The school gained additional honors by the fact that Ross Graham won a University High School Scholarship.

Christmastide In Boort - The Christmas holidays passed off pleasantly in Boort. There was the usual busy scene in the streets on Tuesday evening when an eager crowd of shoppers were "laying in" for the festive day, and

Santa Claus was quietly bagging his gifts behind the scenes. However, there was no war cloud hovering around this season's festival and everybody was heartened by the early prospect of permanent peace and an early reversion to normal conditions.

Loddon Shire public swimming pools will open if the forecast temperature is 23 degrees or over (the forecast is based on Echuca and is obtained from the Bureau of Meteorology at 6pm the previous day).

This will provide Council extra resources to open pools for longer periods on hotter days when the demand is greater.

In the event of pre-booking for schools, swimming clubs or community groups, this policy will not be enforced.

For safety reasons, if lightning is in the immediate area, patrons will be directed to leave the water until the danger has passed. If it is apparent the lightning is not going to pass guickly, the facility will be closed.
