Community urged to have a say in farm trespass MEDIA RELEASE inquiry Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh is encouraging the community to have their say to help fix farm Peter WALSH trespass laws, with a parliamentary inquiry into

the issue now taking public submissions. The inquiry will help determine the best ways to strengthen laws to protect Victorian farmers against farm trespass, following the alarming action of brazen extreme activists who have been illegally entering farms and stealing livestock. Mr Walsh said The Nationals moved to establish the inquiry to make sure regional communities, including people living in towns across the Murray Plains electorate could have their say. "Our farmers deserve laws that protect them against activists illegally coming on to their farms and stealing livestock," Mr Walsh said. "It's clear the laws need fixing when law-breaking activists get fines of just \$1 - it's just a slap on the wrist that only emboldens illegal activists, instead of deterring them. "No-one should have to face the heart-breaking decision of closing down their business, as we saw at Yarragon's Gippy Goat Café, because of the stress of constant harassment and intimidation. "The Nationals stand with our farmers and rural communities, and this inquiry is a first step forward to deliver the change our communities are demanding." They will also provide information regarding how to get assistance in reading your bill, payment options and eligibility for concessions, government grants and other assistance that you may be eligible for.

We value feedback and questions from our customers in Boort as it helps us to better understand the community in which we provide water and wastewater services. From the feedback received so far, we understand there is an interest in knowing more about digital water meters, how to report a fault, billing options and water efficiency.

In regards to digital water meters, Boort is one of the next towns in our region to receive this new technology, with installation planned for July/August this year. Our staff will be able to answer any questions you may have on this project.

On the day, our staff will be able to provide information and water-saving items, including garden trigger nozzles, shower heads, shower timers, tap connectors and our *Smart Gardens* for a *Dry Climate* handbook.



Reminder: e-waste ban starts from 1 July

From this coming Monday (1 July) the Victorian Government's electronic waste (e-waste) ban will come into effect. The ban means no e-waste items can be put in your general household kerbside bin. Instead, e-waste items must be taken to one of Council's landfill or transfer station sites.

E-waste is classified as anything with a battery, plug or cord – from old phones, computers and household appliances to power tools and toys.



Loddon Mallee Waste Info App

It has been quite a while since I have mentioned the Loddon Mallee Waste Info App, and given the focus in recent columns around waste and recycling, I thought it was worth a reminder.

This free app has been developed to help Loddon Shire residents make quick and simple waste and recycling decisions, while aiming to reduce contamination and increase recycling levels.

The app provides you with a personalised bin collection calendar (with optional reminders) and an A to Z list of materials and images showing which bin to put materials in. It also offers information, hints and tips to help with waste management, provides details about Council's waste and recycling services and facilities (including contact details, opening times and maps), and lets you report a problem directly to Council. The app even has push notifications to let you know of changes to collection dates, events and programs. The app is available through the App Store or Google Play. Just search for "Loddon Mallee Waste" and download on your device.

What is the Fire Services Property Levy?

Come late July, property owners will be receiving their 2019/20 annual rates notice from Council. When you look at the breakdown of charges on your notice, you will see an item for the Fire Services Property Levy (FSPL). The FSPL was introduced by the State Government on 1 July 2013. Previously, the levy was paid through insurance premiums. All funds collected goes to supporting Victoria's fire services. There is a concession on the FSPL for eligible pensioners and veterans. Farmers with multiple properties that operate as a single enterprise can also lodge an exemption to pay a single fixed charge.
