ON FARM ENERGY ASSESSMENTS

Agriculture Victoria is rolling out the first action in the Victorian Government's \$30 million Agriculture Energy Investment Plan: free on-farm energy assessments.

The free on-farm assessments will provide farmers with expert advice on how to make smart on-farm energy decisions. The on-farm assessments are available to eligible primary producers until March 2020 or until available funding is exhausted (whichever comes first).

Media Release BOORT PURSUES NEW MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDER

Boort District Health (BDH) is pursuing a range of options to secure the future provision of medical services in Boort, following the announcement by St Anthony Family Medical Practice that it will

cease to operate the Boort Medical Practice clinic from 31 October 2018.

Mrs Wendy Gladman, BDH Board Chair, said maintaining the continuity of medical services in Boort is the Board's primary focus, and that it is actively seeking expressions of interest for a commercial provider to continue to independently operate the Boort Medical Practice.

"A formal expression of interest process is now underway, and further details regarding the outcome of this will be publicly released in the coming weeks," Mrs Gladman said.

"This an attractive opportunity for any medical provider eager to engage with a vibrant local community and a health service committed to supporting it to deliver outstanding primary care."

"We are working very closely with St Anthony Family Medical Group as well as the Rural Workforce Agency Victoria (RWAV) and the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), to ensure continued quality medical services for the people of Boort."
