



Boort Historical Society Inc. Newspaper Snippets

Boort Standard, July 1893

Wednesday afternoon was quite an arbor day in Boort. It was found that the trees supplied for planting in the low lying, swampy ground at the botanical reserve, and it was thereupon decided by the councillors of the riding to plant them on the reserve known as "The Hill," behind the State School.

Consequently, under the supervision of Mr Keast, a number of residents turned out, and commenced digging the holes with great vigor and in thoroughly horticultural style, preparatory to the planting process.

To look at some of the gentlemen at this unaccustomed work, with arms and clothing fluttering in the breeze, and the prosaic pick and shovel being busily plied, the casual observer would come to the conclusion that they were graduating for employment on the new line of railway, but it is very gratifying to know that the work has been commenced and it is to be hoped that the example set on Wednesday will be followed by others.

Messrs Andrews and Gannon have promised to give three watering each during the year, and probably several prizes will be given to State School children for the best kept trees.



What type of support can someone get using the United Minds telehealth service? The same service you would receive if they were visiting a physical office. We can offer you up to 10 bulk billed psychology sessions with a Psychologist. There are no requirements for a face to face session so all 10 sessions can be completed using our telehealth platform.

What is telehealth?

Telehealth is a secure platform that allows is to conduct videoconferencing sessions with people who reside in remote or rural areas.

Who is eligible?

You must live in a remote or rural area (Modified Monash Model areas 4, 5, 6 & 7). To check eligibility, visit www.doctorconnect.gov.au/ click 'search map' and type in the residential address in the search button and tick the box "Department of Health Custom Remoteness Classification - Modified Monash Model".

Do I need a referral?

Yes. You must have a valid Mental Health Care Plan from your GP to receive bulk billed sessions with United Minds.

Who will I see?

You will be booked in with a fully registered psychologist. Depending on support needs, this may be a clinical, counselling, educational and developmental or general psychologist.

FUNDING ON OFFER TO SUPPORT RURAL COMMUNITIES

The program focuses specifically on helping build vibrant and sustainable rural communities with a population of 15,000 or fewer. This year the program is committed to three focus areas that include:

VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY SERVICE GRANTS AVAILABLE

Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh is encouraging local emergency service organizations to apply for funding through the 2019-20 Volunteer Emergency Services Equipment Program (VESEP). Mr Walsh said the program was open to the Country Fire Authority and Victorian State Emergency Services. MAYORAL COLUMN

Better recycling - lids

Thanks to the Loddon Mallee Waste and Resource Recovery Group (LMWRRG), this week I'd like to share some handy hints around better recycling. When it comes to **plastic lids**, if the lids are large, for example from a peanut butter jar, then they can go in the recycling on their own or attached. This also applies to metal lids on glass jars.



Smaller plastic lids that are on drink bottles should be screwed back onto the bottle, as unattached lids are too small for recycling machinery and cannot be processed. It is important to make sure that the bottle is empty and it helps to squeeze some of the air out of the bottle. This not only gives you more room in your kerbside recycling bin, but helps avoid compressed cubes of baled plastic breaking open due to air expansion.

Never place your recycling in plastic bags. The soft plastics take extra time to open on the sorting line, causing inefficiency. They can also jam the machinery, delaying the process and can cause damage.

Aluminium foil can be easily recycled. Just make sure it's clean (giving it a wipe down is fine), then ball it up and save it. Continue to add more foil to the ball, making it grow. When the aluminium foil is the size of a tennis ball it can go in your recycling bin.

Rigid plastic tubs that meat comes in are also mostly recyclable – just check the container for a number in the triangle. If it has a number 1 to 6 it can be recycled. Peel the soft film from the top (it's okay if a little bit is stuck to the rim) and put any absorbent pads in the waste bin. It's a good idea to rinse the meat trays to prevent odours and remove residual fluid.

Polystyrene is not recyclable through your kerbside bin, even if it has the triangle number symbol on it. As long as your polystyrene is clean, there are a small number of locations in the Loddon Mallee area where you can take it to be recycled. These can be found by downloading the Loddon Mallee Waste App via your app store and searching "Loddon Mallee".

Broken drinking glasses don't go in your recycling bin. This is because glasses melt at a different temperature to glass bottles and jars, contaminating the recycling stream. Wrap broken glasses up in paper and place in the waste bin. **Window glass** should also be treated this way.

Pet Exchange Register to improve sale transparency

Victorians can now find out where their pet comes from with the introduction of a new online database called the Pet Exchange Register (PER). Dogs and cats advertised for sale or give away now need a source number from the PER, which identifies an individual, breeder, business or shelter. Victorians getting a new pet will be encouraged to check the validity of a seller on the register before they bring their new dog, cat, puppy or kitten home. It will be an offence for an advertisement not to have a valid microchip number and a PER source number – this applies to advertisers selling or giving away dogs, cats, puppies and kittens, as well as publishers of the advertisements.

Storytime at BRIC
