

As part of Victoria's Gambling Harm Awareness Week (7_{th} - 13_{th} October), Northern District Community Health and Anglicare Victoria's Gambler's Help program, are offering 'Mental Health First Aid for Gambling Harm' courses. The FREE courses will be in Kerang at NDCH on Tuesday 29_{th} of October and in Swan Hill at the Town Hall on Thursday 31_{st} of October. The courses start at 10.00am and go for half a day.

The 'Mental Health First Aid for Gambling Harm' course gives people:

- Knowledge about mental illness and harm because of gambling.
- Information about the risk factors, signs and symptoms of gambling problems.
- The motivations of a person who has a gambling problem.
- Skills on how to talk to someone about their gambling problems.
- Information on relapse and how this can affect someone with gambling problems.
- Strategies to manage your own self-care while helping someone with gambling problems.
- A chance to practice their new skills in a safe and supportive environment.

Following the course, participants can speak with our support staff one on one about what support services available and referral options.



BOORT ANGLING CLUB CARP ERADICATION AND FAMILY WEEKEND 2019

Held on 19th and 20th October was once again a great success. Probably due to unpleasant windy conditions there were less carp caught than in previous years. 173 this year compared to 313 last year and average length of fish down from 55cm last year to 51cm this year. Over the last five years there have been 1467 carp taken out of the lake during official competition time. There have also been many more taken over these weekends. This year the carp were taken by K & C FISHERIES and will be made use of for fertiliser or stock feed products etc.

The number of fisher persons has kept on increasing. In 2015 there were 102 entrants, 2016 there were 103, 2017 there were 130, 2018 there were 221, This year 282 entries.




