


Funfarm2you is returning for all you baby animal lovers, there are a multitude of horse events as well as an exciting Dog Trial.

Boort Historical Society Inc.

A Brief History of the Boort Agricultural and Pastoral Society Show

The first district show was held in October 1879 at the Catumnal Wesleyan Church, which is about 10 miles west of Boort. This first show attracted an attendance of around 500 people.

In 1880 the Boort District Pastoral and Agricultural Society was formed and the Inaugural Show was held on the 22nd October, 1880, at Boort in the newly erected Pound Yards – that is down the west end of Boort on the old salt flats.

By 1881 the attendance at the Boort Show was estimated at 2,000 people- visitors attending from Inglewood, Bridgewater, East Charlton, Sandhurst, Melbourne and Ballarat.

1882 saw the first appearance of the Boort Brass Band. A special train from Sandhurst brought 500 people, and the show crowd of over 1500 came from a radius of over 40 miles – this of course in horse and buggy, riding horses, or walking with exhibits of preserves and breads and home baked goods and livestock in hand.

By 1885 the Show held 56 entries in home-made bread, 60 entries in fresh butter and an attendance of 3,000 people resulted in a £70 gate.

In 1888 Boort had a Grand National Show – attendance was 4,000 and gate takings were £94. Two special trains were required to accommodate traffic between Korong Vale and Boort and there were 1,700 exhibits – imagine bringing chooks, pigs, sheep, etc. on the trains to exhibit them at the Show. The Governor His Excellency Sir H B Loch attended the Boort Show in that year and there was a Guard of Honour from Durham Ox Mounted Rifles.

The Boort Trotting Club is Australia's oldest and you will still see a 3 race Trotting Event at the Boort Show – a great spectacle.

Horses have always played a large part in the Boort Show with a well deserved reputation for running a large program in four or five rings – Show Jumping and Olympic Jumping. In 1911 it was moved that ladies be allowed to ride astride as well as side-saddle!

The price of a cup of tea with sandwich or bun had risen to sixpence to meet rising costs!

In 1889 prizes were given for the most sparrow heads and eggs collected (two eggs to count as one head), sparrows being of pest proportions.

By 1919 special prizes were again offered for sparrows and starlings heads and eggs, five eggs counting as one head, and the Secretary to do the tallying. Very politically incorrect these days!

In 1927 the showgrounds were flooded and the Show postponed to November 10th when His Excellency, the Governor of Victoria Lord Stradbroke opened the show and toured the district.

Parking fees of two shillings for motor cars was introduced in 1924.

In 1929 the building and Grandstand were relocated to the area known as Boort Park where the Show continues to be held these days, and incidentally Boort Show is the only Show still being conducted in the Loddon Shire – something for the Show Committees and volunteers over the years to be very proud of.


In 1943 the Pyramid Hill Pipe Band and the Boort Band played at the show to the crowds great enjoyment, and the average cost of growing a bushel of wheat was 3/10 ½d or 39c.

During the war years the Show was not held, but a combined Carnival and Gymkhana and Ball were organised and the proceeds donated to the War Effort and the Red Cross.

It is pleasing to see the sixth and seventh generation descendants of the original committee taking an active part in organising and conducting the Show, which has proved of so much value to the district since its beginnings.

The community of Boort survives on the work of volunteers and they are all to be commended on the continuing success of the Boort Agricultural and Pastoral Society Show. The Boort Show has an interesting and colourful history – I hope you have enjoyed this reminder of the way things were.



Do I need a referral? Yes. You must have a valid Mental Health Care Plan from your GP to receive bulk billed sessions with United Minds.

Who will I see? You will be booked in with a fully registered psychologist. Depending on support needs. this may be a clinical, counselling, educational and developmental or general psychologist. E-waste changes and charges

With the introduction of the Victorian Government's electronic waste (e-waste) ban from 1 July this year, there has understandably been some confusion about what constitutes e-waste. I'll try to clarify the new arrangements in this column.

E-waste is classified as anything with a battery, plug or cord. This includes old phones, computers, printers, household appliances (such as clock radios, hair dryers, toasters, food processors), white goods, power tools and even toys and hand-held video games. E-waste also includes lighting products, such as LEDs and fluorescent lamps.

The ban means no e-waste items can be put in your general household kerbside bin. However, Council will still continue to collect e-waste items at its landfill and transfer station sites during normal operating hours.

There are currently fees in place to dispose of certain e-waste items. Televisions, monitors and computers (including laptops) have a fee of \$13.00 per item, and there is a fee of \$17.00 per item for refrigerators, freezers or air conditioners (prices include GST).

There is no charge to dispose of small appliances (including those items mentioned above - clock radios, toasters, toys, hair dryers, etc.).

A number of white good products also do not attract a fee, such as a microwave, which will be processed as scrap metal. Furthermore, there is no charge to dispose of fluorescent light tubes. rechargeable batteries and IT accessories (such as a mouse or keyboard).

Healthy Heart of Victoria funding announcement welcomed

Council has welcomed the announcement from Minister for Regional Development Jaclyn Symes regarding funding for Healthy Heart of Victoria project activities in our Shire.

Council received \$300,000 towards infrastructure and activation initiatives. This includes \$20,000 to recruit and train volunteer lifeguards, \$140,000 for Boort Lake Precinct Activation.

The first initiative of its kind in Loddon, the funding will include the installation of outdoor fitness equipment at Boort and Wedderburn. The initial installation of this equipment is planned for this September. A host of fitness activities aimed to inspire physical activity in the community is also being planned for the launch.



HAVE YOUR SAY ON NEW SAFETY STANDARDS FOR BACKYARD POOLS AND SPAS

The Leader of The Nationals and Member for Murray Plains Peter Walsh has encouraged all homeowners with swimming pools to have their say on the drafted Building Amendment (Swimming Pool and Spa) Regulations 2019.

Mr Walsh said the proposed regulations include the mandatory requirement for owners of private swimming pools and spas to register them with their local council, as well as to engage a registered building surveyor or inspector to inspect and certify the compliance of safety barriers every three years.

"The new regulations will commence on 1st December 2019 and the proposed implementation period will require owners of existing swimming pools and spas to take action by 14th April 2020."

Mr Walsh said the regulations, as well as a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) that examines the costs and benefits of the proposed regulations and alternative options that were considered, are now available for public consultation.

"This is an opportunity for anyone interested to have their say on the proposed regulations before they are finalised.

"Given the vast numbers of home pools across the Murray Plains electorate and the significant requirements that are proposed for those pools, I urge all stakeholders to take part in the public consultation process."

The Exposure Draft, the Regulatory Impact Statement, and the submission document are all available online at https://engage.vic.gov.au/new-safety-standards-private-swimming-pools-and-spas

Submissions will be accepted until 5 pm on 6th September 2019.
