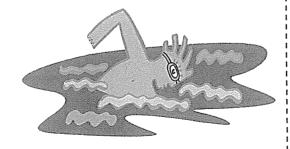

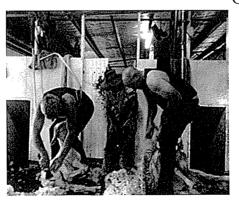

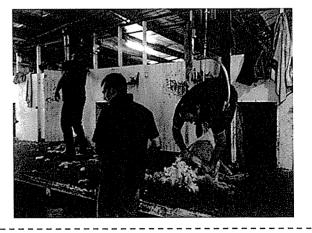

V/Line Changes for Summer

In the heat of summer rail tracks expand and can buckle so trains need to slow down to make the trip safe and comfortable for customers. When the temperature hits 36 degrees V/Line applies heat restrictions. The train speed is reduced to 90km/h and this could extend the journey by more than 30 minutes. Heat speed restrictions usually affect services from midday to 8:00pm and the Swan Hill train is one of the most affected.

Some long distance services will be operated by VLocity trains as close to the destination as possible and then customers will be transferred to air-conditioned coaches for the remainder of the journey. The hot weather timetable will be activated two days in advance.

V/Line asks customers to allow extra travel time when the temperature is over 36 degrees. They can also sign up for V/Line Inform SMS or email updates and get the latest information through Twitter, via the My Line app or by visiting vline.com.au

Free Tram Travel in CBD from January 1 2015

The new free tram zone in the Melbourne central business district and docklands will operate from January 1 2015. Customers in Zone 2 will now be able to travel in Zones 1 and 2 for a Zone 1 fare. For this they will need to touch on and off with their myki as normal.

V/Line customers will still receive free metropolitan travel after touching on, depending on the zones they are travelling in. This applies on metropolitan trains, trams and buses.

Travel in 1-5 zones = 2 hour fare

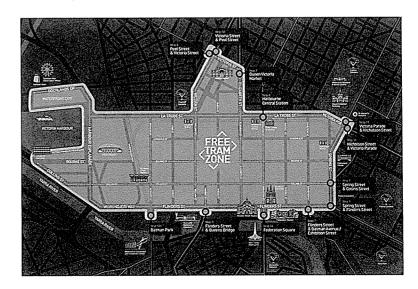
Travel in 6-11 zones = 3 hour fare

Travel in 12-3 zones = 4 hour fare

Customers making a return/Line trip the same day will continue to receive unlimited travel in the zones covered by their return ticket

People staying over night or more than one day in Melbourne can take advantage of the Free Tram Zone at no extra cost. (No myki card required to use Free Tram Zone)

Zone 2 will still exist and travel entirely within Zone 2 will be at a lower fare.



SANTA SUIT lost

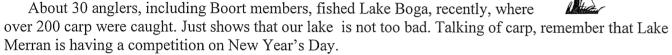

Guest Speaker: Dr Rob Moodie Australia Day Ambassador

Rob Moodie is Professor of Public Health, University of Melbourne. Between 1998 and 2007 he was the CEO of VicHealth, the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation.

Since 1979 he has worked for Save the Children Fund, Medicins Sans Frontieres, the Aboriginal Health Service in Alice Springs, the Burnett Institute, the World Health Organization and the joint United Nations' Program on HIV/AIDS.

He chaired the National Preventative Health Task Force from 2008-2011 and he chairs the Technical Panel for the Gates Foundation's HIV prevention program in India. He chaired the Melbourne Storm Rugby League Club until 2011. He Is Co-editor of four books, including Hands on Health Promotion, with his most recent being Recipes for a Great Life written with Gabriel Gate.

He is married to Anne, a physiotherapist, and they have two children, Nick and Penny.

SWIMMING POOL SHADE STRUCTURES

Shade structures have been erected across Loddon at each of the region's five pools.

Each pool has benefited from a 10x10 metre shade structure installed in the shallow end of each of Council's five pools.

Wedderburn and Mitiamo also received shade structures over the toddler's pool while Boort had a shade structure installed over its barbecue area and learner's pool.

The project cost \$150,000, with \$110,000 from the state government's Sport and Recreation Fund and Loddon Shire Council chipping in the remaining \$40,000.

The shade structures will not only provide an attractive feature, but they will also provide swimmers with more protection from the harsh sun.

Council invests in emergency water supply points for farmers

Farmers are yet to see a reprieve from the dry weather conditions with dams across Loddon drying up, and current forecasts predicting an extended and dry summer period.

In light of current pressures being placed on farmers to keep water up to their stock, Council has stepped up to the challenge and has been working with the Victorian Farmers Federation to provide a viable solution for emergency stock and domestic water supplies over the pending summer period as well as into the future.

Last month Council put together a plan to install four emergency water supply standpipes, thus expanding the existing standpipe network from seven to 11. The new standpipe sites are different from the existing facilities in that they will not operate on the existing Avdata key system and will not provide for an overhead fill point (i.e. low fill point only).

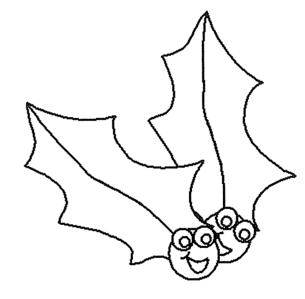
The four new supply points have been located on either existing pressurised pipelines or groundwater bores in areas believed to offer the best accessibility to those farmers most affected by the dry conditions. Operation of the emergency supply points will be different to existing standpipes in that residents wishing to access water from these sites will need to register at the Shire office and obtain a manual key and log book.

New emergency supply standpipe locations are as follows: the corner of Borung-Wedderburn Road and Boort-Wedderburn Road, at the Bridgewater Recreation Reserve, Logan Bore on the Emu-Logan Road and at Yeungroon. The installation of these four standpipes is a worthy investment into Loddon's farming future and it's expected to help the hip pocket for many farmers around the region.
