Newcastle pilot Scott Barrett crosses three states to smash world hang gliding record and he took off from Boort.

Travelling 570 kilometres in one day is a good effort for anyone, but to do it powered purely by the elements is a world record.

Newcastle pilot Scott Barrett smashed the previous record held for distance-to-goal hang gliding by more than 190 kilometres.

It is the result of plenty of hard work and planning, plus some favourable conditions.

"To get a record it means you have to get things right. I've been watching the weather, especially in the early part of December, because it's a race against the sun," Mr Barrett said.

"I saw a weather window that looked quite good, so I drove from Newcastle to Boort, stayed overnight at the airstrip and the next day set up my glider and then went for the record. It was a very well-planned exercise to break the record."

The aerial journey saw him take off from the Victorian town of Boort, soar across New South Wales and set down in South Australia.

The remote sheep station of Mooleulooloo where Mr Barrett landed was chosen because it has one of the last airstrips in the region that still has road access.

Having a hang glider silently arrive on his property came as a bit of a surprise to station owner Brian Treloar.

"When he knocked on the door, I thought he was a roo shooter, but he didn't look like a roo shooter. If I had of known he was coming I would have been worried about him," Mr Treloar said.

#### World record hang gliding flight continued:

After nine hours and twenty minutes in the air, Mr Barrett was met on the ground by his wife and young daughter who had been tracking him via GPS and in contact via radio.

As a take-off point, Boort is not famous for its mountains, so the record attempt required a little help to actually get into the air.

"We start off with a tow behind a micro-light aircraft, and then we release from the rope and start gliding from there. The gliding is done by finding some rising air and then gliding to find the next rising air."

It is the same principle that allows birds to fly for long distances without having to flap their wings; in fact it is not uncommon for hang gliders to share the airspace with eagles as man and bird both make use of thermals.

The conditions in the area also played a part in the record-breaking effort.

"Victoria is special because the further south you get, the more early morning clouds you get indicating where the lift is. Boort in particular has a very good road network," Mr Barrett said.

After nine hours and twenty minutes in the air, Mr Barrett was met on the ground by his wife and young daughter who had been tracking him via GPS and in contact via radio.

Breaking world hang gliding records and spending almost 10 hours in the air is just one aspect of hang gliding, and Mr Barrett said there were plenty of ways to take to the air and have adventures.

"It's like a 3D yacht race and the views are better by far. There are wonderful adventures to be had. Hang gliders have become a very safe and fun aircraft, it takes a week to achieve a pilot certificate and you can participate in it from flatlands, from mountains, coastal hills or sand dunes, it is all great fun."

After such a huge effort and distance, Mr Barrett is looking forward to some more local airtime.

"The next flying for me will be at home on the coast, in bare feet, shorts and T-shirt, enjoying a day flying around on the sand dunes at our local beach. I love making flights from the local mountains and flying over Lake Macquarie to my home, packing up on my own front lawn."

# Have your say through Public Transport Survey

Have your say on improved passenger rail services for Loddon Released on 14 January 2015 Loddon Shire Council has joined forces with the northern municipalities of Swan Hill, Gannawarra, Campaspe and Greater Bendigo to progress one of its key advocacy priorities - improved passenger rail services. Loddon Mayor, Cr Gavan Holt, said stage one of the joint 'Railing Ahead' advocacy strategy will kick off in January with a community survey designed to gather information on local public transport usage and what type of train service people need. "Public transport is an important service to all rural communities, connecting people with the services they need and contributing to quality of life. However, we hold a concern that the current level of passenger rail services in northern Victoria does not adequately meet the needs of locals or visitors to the region," Cr Holt said. "As a case in point, the Swan Hill train line currently has only two return train services per day and the Echuca line has only one service each week day and two on weekends. By comparison, smaller communities on the Melbourne-Bendigo rail line benefit from up to 20 return train services per day." The Mayor said that improving passenger rail services for those who live, do business or visit northern Victoria is vitally important to the region for a wide range of social and economic reasons. "Some of the expected benefits of improving the frequency of passenger trains include expanding employment and education opportunities, improving access to general and specialist medical services, increasing participation in recreation and social activities, and increasing tourism to the region."

For Loddon, the aim of the advocacy strategy is to achieve an increase in the frequency of passenger services to the key destinations of Dingee and Pyramid Hill, both of which already have train stations. Stage one of the Railing Ahead advocacy strategy will involve a three-pronged approach including engaging the community to gather information, continuing discussions with Public Transport Victoria (PTV) and raising community awareness. "As part of preparing a business case that could support government investment in enhanced rural rail services, it is important to have meaningful data and a solid understanding of public transport usage and needs in the region," Cr Holt said. "To achieve this understanding, a survey will be widely distributed throughout the local government areas of Swan Hill, Gannawarra, Loddon, Campaspe and Greater Bendigo, with a specific focus on the Swan Hill and Echuca lines. "We encourage all members of the community to complete the survey so that the views of students, workers, families, business people, tourists and those who rely on public transport to get around, can be represented accurately to government decision-makers. "We will present the findings of the survey to PTV and the Victorian Government in an effort to secure train and bus services that better align to community and visitor needs." The survey will examine existing passenger rail patronage levels, destination and purpose of travel, levels of satisfaction with current services and likely demand for more frequent services.

The Railing Ahead community survey is open from Monday, 12 January until Friday, 27 February 2015. It is available on Council's website www.loddon.vic.gov.au and in hard copy from Council's customer service centres in Wedderburn, Serpentine and BRIC. In addition to the survey, the partner councils will target input from specific individuals and groups including tourism bodies, health providers, the business sector and regular train users. "While improved rail services has long been an advocacy priority of Council, the gathering of data over coming months provides an opportunity to initiate discussions with the new Victorian Government regarding the region's public transport issues and needs," the Mayor added - See more at: http://www.loddon.vic.gov.au/Our-documents/News-and-announcements/Have your-say-on-improved-passenger-rail-services-for-Loddon#sthash.2QsYxNM1.dpuf
