You can:

- Have your identity confirmation documents copied and certified
- Use the telephone to access the departments self service options, claim Medicare rebates, speak to the department or call prospective employers.
- Fax and photocopy documents
- Access forms and brochures

The Access Point is a self-help facility with no assistance from staff except for copying and certifying documents, there is no departmental staff present on site.

THE GAWNE FAMILY OF BOORT. Compiled April 2015.

The Gawne family have a long association with Boort in business, farming, church, community, sport and social events. Mrs T.A. Gawne (nee Ellen May Vear) came to Boort as a baby in a wagon in the 1870's from the gold fields in Ballarat. She was a sickly baby and the Doctor wrote out her death certificate befor the family left Ballarat. She was not expected to survive the long journey. Ellen carried her death certificate until she died in 1940 and is buried with her husband in the Boort cemetery.

Boort Development Committee (BDC) Report - April 2015

Boort is now officially an **RV Friendly Town**. The works at Boort Park have been completed for the required dump point, together with an area for free RV Parking for up to 96 hours. Signage around the town has been installed. An RV Friendly certification is an important factor in attracting tourists, and the new facilities are now being used regularly.

The **Boort Eastern Entrance Project** (Stage 3) works are continuing, with the focus now on major improvements to Nolens Park. New shelters will soon be erected at the southern end of the playground area, and a path linking this area through to Federation Walk will also be laid. We are working with Loddon Shire on a proposal for new play equipment for the Nolens Park playground. Planting out of the new garden beds by BDC and others is planned to mark the successful conclusion of this project.

We continue to work on our plan to make Boort widely known for high class **Metal Sculpture**. This strategy can bring thousands of visitors to Boort and ideally will keep them here for more than a day trip. The stunning **Dragon Fly** we installed near the Boardwalk has created great interest and looks spectacular. And we are working with the Shire to install both **Rusty The Redfin** and John Piccoli's large **Spanner Seat Sculpture** around the lake.

Loddon Shire has commenced the planning for a major upgrade to the main street of Boort – this is called the **Boort Streetscape Project**. Consultants in charge of this important project have been appointed, and they are Outlines Landscape Architecture. Interested Boort residents can follow the progress of this project at: www.abouttown.org. The community will have opportunities to participate in the planning and design, and to this end Outlines are holding a town meeting in the Boort main street from 10.00am on Friday 1st May (see the website for details). Details will also be posted in shop windows – initially the old chemist window.

BDC is an Open Committee - interested residents are welcome. The next meeting is on Monday 4th May, 7:30pm at BRIC.






