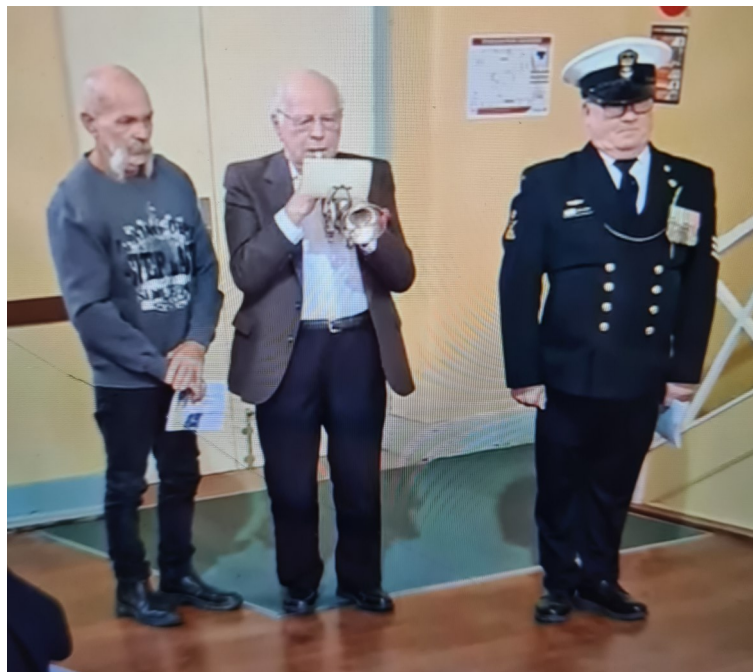

# Boort Lawn Tennis Club

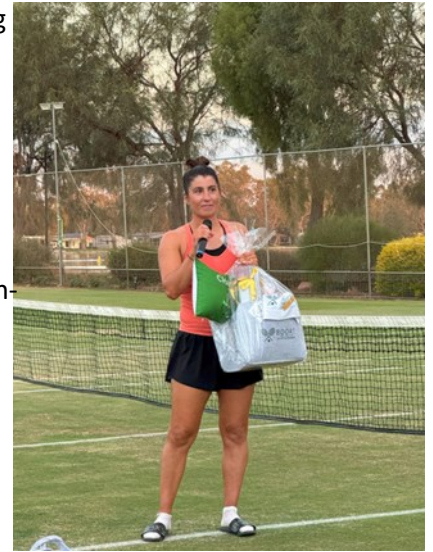
## Easter Tennis Tournament

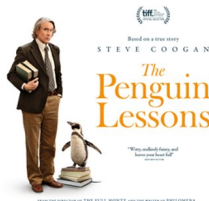
