What a wonderful day it turned out to be, and the organisers & volunteers are to be congratulated on such a very successful event.

Occasionally, we get asked if we can give a discount on items in the shop!!! Not very often – and usually not from locals – the only time we would consider this is if the item was slightly imperfect, after all, our prices are very reasonable, but having said that – there are many customers who will "round up" the sale to a higher price (usually locals) knowing that our money does go to our local hospital for which we are always most grateful. Then we occasionally get a very rare request – as one gentleman did recently, he asked if we sell Tobacco??, the sales lady at the time was quite bewildered as to why he thought we would have such an item in stock, then after discussing this amongst ourselves, we realized that someone had told hem we sell "Chop Chop" – poor man – he thought they said "Op Shop"!!, we sell a great variety of items –but not "Chop Chop"

We often receive local produce from our locals out of their garden; we usually offer these free to our customers and plants we sell for a small donation. In the tomato season we receive large amounts of bottles of home-made sauce donated from Jacqui Verley – which she does year in year out, always a sell out. In the past a very dear member, (I think we all know who she is!!) would donate her famous marmalade – but is unable to continue this now – so a huge Thank You to these people and everyone who takes the time to donate these goodies to the shop.

Boort came alive on October 2nd with the sounds, flavours, and spirit of Weaving Culture Didgeridoo & Tucker, as locals gathered for an evening of shared food, learning and conversation. Around 50 people attended, making the Boort Memorial Hall buzz with the sounds (and delicious aromas!) of shared celebration.

Renowned didgeridoo artist Ganga Giri captivated everyone with his powerful performance, acknowledgement of the country and generous storytelling. He spoke about the cultural significance of ochre, even bringing some along for the community to see and use.

The bush tucker cooking demo was a hit – so much so that it couldn't quite be completed on time, with so many great questions from the crowd! Guests savoured the flavours of Lemon Myrtle Pumpkin Soup, Wattleseed Scones, Outback Bush Curry with Saltbush and Pepperleaf Couscous, and Native Thyme and Cinnamon Chicken Skewers with Quandong Chutney. Each dish offered a delicious taste of Australia's native ingredients.

Meanwhile, the women's basket weaving workshop led by Mel was a crowd favourite, with participants proudly taking home their weaving kits – and hopefully continuing their creations at home.

The event was made possible thanks to the generous support of the National Indigenous Australians Agency, Boort Resource and Information Centre, Northern District Community Health, and Boort District Health.

There's already talk of holding more events like this in the future – stay tuned.
